WATERED CROPS GROW RAPIDLY

Cutting of Hay Underway; Second Crop Halted by Weevil in Some Sections

Irrigated crops throughout the states have had rapid development, the first cutting of alfalfa is underway in the intermediate and higher districts and the second crop is being retarded by weevil at Deseret and in the Salt Lake valley, says the weekly range and crop review issued by J. Cecil Alter, state meteorologist.

The report follows: A rapid development of all irrigated crops was noted this week, though the land grains, being in the filling and ripening stages, have continued to deteriorate for want of rain; spring sown varieties will not mature a crop in parts of Salt Lake County.

Winter wheat is in the dough stage at Oak City, and is being cut at Modena, where rye has been cut at Park Valley some rye has been cut for hay. The first cutting of alfalfa is being made generally in the intermediate and higher valleys, the work being well along at Mantle, and half done at Richfield; heavy crops are reported at Heber and Price. At Deseret and in the Salt Lake valley the second alfalfa crop is being retarded by weevil, though the weather has been rather favorable for stubble muling.

Favorable weather has aided weevil spraying in the Sevier and Sanpete valleys. Tomatoes have done well, though the crop is late. Canning peas, potatoes, and beets have also done well. Beets promise unusually well at Mantle. Some irrigating has been done in the best fields at Richfield, and the field work is well along. Fruit has developed favorably and cherry picking has advanced rapidly.

The late apple crop is small at Heber, but apples at Elberta are doing much better. The lower ranges and some pastures in intermediate levels are showing the need for rain, though showers on the 28th and 29th were beneficial locally. The higher ranges, where most of the stock are now grazing, are excellent and stock continue thrifty.

Highways have been improved locally by showers, though they are still dusty and rutty as a rule.

Gambling Among Chinese Must Stop Say City Officials

Gambling among Chinese in Ogden is to be stamped out. The celestials were given warning this morning that any attempts to conceal games of chance as they have in the past will mean the immediate swooping down of officers of the law upon them, with the authority of the mayor and city commission behind them to take any course necessary in bringing the guilty ones to justice.

The ultimatum came following a report made by J. May Ward, commissioner of public safety following protest of Charlie Sloan and a Chinese delegation yesterday to the commission that they were being persecuted by police officers. Sloan declared that during a recent raid upon a Chinese store the officers broke down their doors and used rough tactics which he intimated should not be indulged in by the policemen.

Commissioner Ward reported at the meeting this morning that the case had been thoroughly investigated and when he completed an outline of his plan in the matter it was apparent that the officers would have done well to have kept their noses to their own business. It resulted in the matter of gambling being brought to an issue, in which it is made clear that the officials will emerge from the battle second best if they insist upon carrying on games in the future.

Commissioner Ward and Mayor Francis today morning, the case was taken by officers Walter Moore and Robert Chambers in raiding the Chinese store at 2445 Grant avenue last week, in which several alleged gamblers were arrested and later are said to have forfeited their bail.

The Chinese yesterday cried that the officers in their doors and took \$300 of their money as they were quietly sitting about and conversing innocently among bags of rice and tea in the basement of the store.

The officers' side of the story was entirely different. They declared they had raided the place early in the evening and had arrested several of the men who were sitting about. They returned thirty minutes later, they said, and surprised participants of another game who evidently thought that one raid was enough for one evening and they were safe.

McAdoo, Secretary of the Treasury. This counterfeit is a very poor straight photographic note, no attempt being made to color the seal or serial number on the face of the note. The denominational numbers have been colored with white ink. The back of the note shows a bungling attempt at coloring with green crayon. The note should not deceive the ordinary holder of money."

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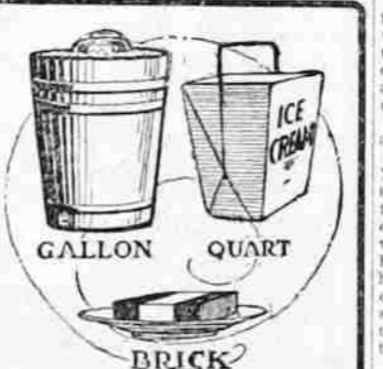
