FARMER-LABOR WHEAT OUTLOOK LEADERS QUIT ALARMS GRANGE

State Vice Chairman and Assistant Secretary Claim I. W. W. Control Party

SALT LAKE, Aug. 5.—Two leaders in the Utah activities of the Farmer-Labor party last night made public a letter of resignation to George Crosby, state chairman of the party, because, they charged, Industrial Workers of the World were in control of the party.

The two former officers of the party said they had been told by I. W. W. influence had been active in the party, accused some members of that organization of seeking to subvert the new party to their own ends, and made a general denunciation of radicalism.

The letter called attention to pronouncements by Parley P. Christensen, the party's presidential nominee, against the I. W. W., and said he had failed to live up to these statements. Both signers of the letter live here, which also is Christensen's residence.

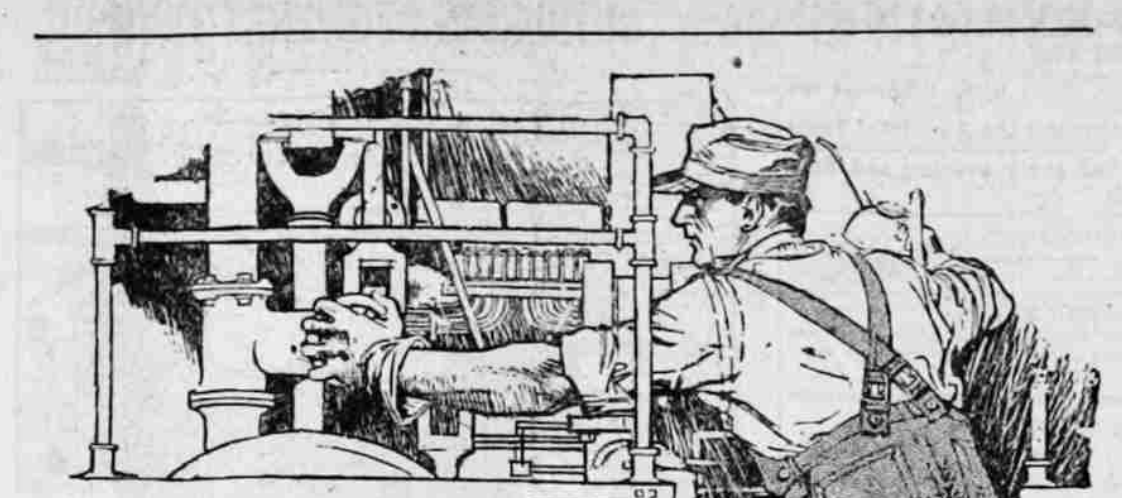
