LEANNESS While some persons suffer from excessive fat production, others are troubled because they are underweight in proportion to their height. The condition may depend upon one of several factors.

1. There may be a hereditary predisposition to spareness of body. 2. It may be due in part to excessive mental or physical exertion.

3. It may be caused by some obscure disease, such as tuberculosis, or to perversion of the nutrition processes of the body. The condition is brought about by mental states such as worry and anxiety, as well as by lack of rest and sleep.

4. It is true that persons of slender build are often stronger, more enduring and more resistant to disease than those who are inclined to stoutness, yet thought slenderness may mean physical weakness and susceptibility to disease.
