

Irrigation District Formation Will Be Voted on Tomorrow

With the election which will determine whether or not the Weber county irrigation district shall be organized taking place tomorrow, three statements bearing on the point in question were issued today at the offices of the Weber county farm bureau.

Only persons whose names appear on the polling list can vote at the election for the proposed irrigation district for Weber county tomorrow (August 10th). This list will give the names of land owners as they appeared on the county records on October 1, 1919. Any changes of title since that date will not appear on the official polling list.

With reference to the power of the board of directors to obligate the district, you are advised that the board will be prohibited from making a contract or purchasing property with a consideration exceeding \$10,000 and not exceeding \$25,000 unless such contract or purchase is first authorized and ratified in writing by a majority of the votes according to the number of votes cast in the last election; nor will any such contract or purchase in excess of \$25,000 be binding upon the district unless authorized and ratified at an election in the manner as is provided in the issuance of bonds.

WATCH KEPT ON SPEEDING CARS Sheriff's Force Out on State Road Looking for Offenders

With members of the sheriff's department patrolling every road leading into Ogden and police officers on the alert within the city limits, the campaign against automobile speeding and other infractions of the law regarding motor vehicles, was in full swing last night.

Deputy Sheriff Dick Wootton who was one of the most active officers on the county highways reported this morning that few instances where motorists were known evading the law were discovered during his vigil. There were a few cases, he said, where cars were being driven with one headlight or with tail lights not burning, but in most instances the drivers had no knowledge the lights were not burning.

The campaign will be carried on with all intensity in the future, Sheriff Peterson stated today and not only will the officers watch for speeders but for drivers who use but one light, no tail light, wrong numbers or glaring headlights.

Engineer Figuring on Bigger Water System With City Engineer Joseph M. Tracy completing figures and estimates for the enlarging of the city's water distribution system and the erection of a municipal electric lighting plant, Mayor Frank Francis announced this morning that the date of a city bond election will be held with the hopes that the city voters will be authorized to enlarge the water system to a point where the city may be supplied for years to come in its rapid growth and the building of a municipal lighting plant so that Ogden residents may be given cheaper rates.

Tests to determine whether or not the water flow from the artesian wells in Ogden canyon can be accelerated with pumps and air compression will be held as soon as the low water period is passed, according to Mayor Frank Francis. No attempt will be made which might hamper the flow until the city has ceased to draw so heavily upon the present supply and the warmest weather period is over.
