WOMAN'S PARTY SPENDS \$150,000 FOR AMENDMENT

WASHINGTON, Aug. 21.—The campaign of the national woman's party for ratification of the suffrage amendment has cost \$150,000, according to an announcement tonight. Party officers estimated at least \$80,000 was spent to get the thirty-sixth ratification, at least \$10,000 of which is yet to be raised.

INJUNCTION BY ANTIS DELAYS FINAL ACTION

SENATE PROBE COMMITTEE TO EXAMINE FUNDS

Senator Spencer Announces He Will Resign as Member of Board

ST. LOUIS, Mo., Aug. 21.—Senator S. P. Spencer announced today he would resign as a member of the special senate campaign expenditures investigating committee. In announcing his intention to quit he issued a statement explaining that he, being a candidate for reelection, would prefer being no longer a member of the committee, as the investigation might be extended into the expenditures of candidates during the primary election and that under those conditions, his own expenditures would be subject to investigation.

LEAVE THE STATE

RED FORTIFICATIONS ON RIVER ARE DESTROYED

WASHINGTON, Aug. 21.—Fortifications of the Bolsheviki army at the entrances to the Dnieper river are reported in official advice received today by the state department to have been destroyed by General Wrangels forces.

FEDERAL JUDGE ORDERS INCREASE IN CARFARE

DES MOINES, Ia., Aug. 21.—Six-cent street car fare was authorized by Federal Judge Wade today. The fare has been five cents.

ENCOUNTER FRESH ARMY

Initiating the maneuver executed in 1821 by Nicholas I. Bolsheviki have withdrawn a section of their forces to attack from the north, the situation of which is grave, is decided.

FACE ANNIHILATION

Scattered over nearly 180 miles along the frontier of East Prussia between Strasbourg and Ostralenka, these red forces seem condemned to annihilation unless they take refuge on Prussian territory. To diminish the pressure in the main theatre between the Narw and the Bug, the Bolsheviki have undertaken a demonstration for publicizing the attacking Polish and Ukrainian positions on the Stripa. Their cavalry has crossed the upper course of the Bug and Cassack pastures are appearing once again before Lubersberg. This operation, however, is considered too belated to effect any change in the general situation.

G. O. P. LEADERS DENY CONNECTION WITH BOOK
