UTAH CROPS GO OVER AVERAGE

Estimates Show 103.8 Per Cent of Ten Year Figures

Crops estimates for Utah for 1920 reach the gratifying proportions of 103.8 per cent of the ten-year average.

The gain in the month of August over the nation was 1.7 per cent. In Oklahoma the gain in the one month was as high as 18.6 per cent.

The level of prices paid producers of the United States for the principal crops decreased about 10.6 per cent during August, in the past ten years the price level decreased about 11.2 per cent during August.

Olive Thomas' Next To Last Picture at 'The Ogden' Today

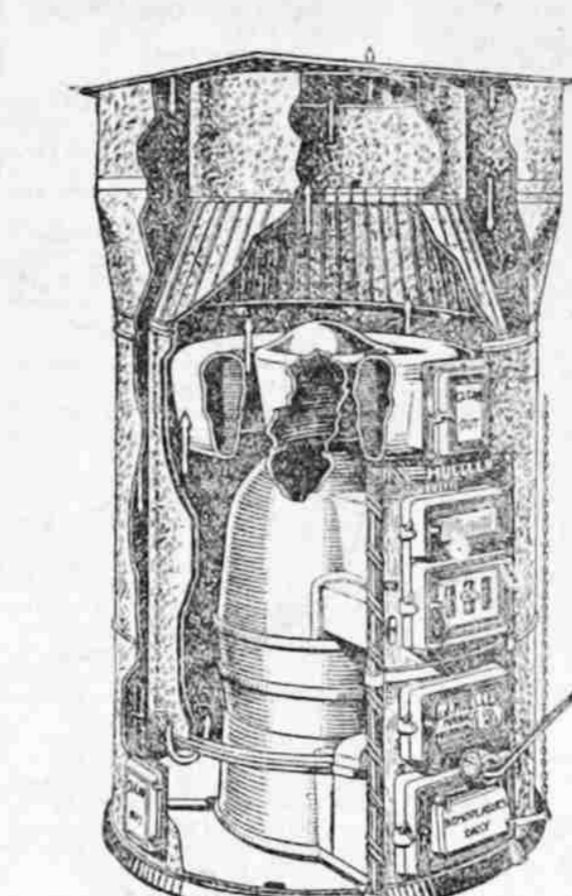
