NOGGLE TO GO BACK TO FLYING

Ogden Man Gets Appointment In Aviation Corps With Rank of Captain

Appointment, with the rank of captain in the United States army air service has been received by Roy L. Noggle of Ogden formerly with the army aviation service in Hawaii, at various camps in the United States and in France during the war. The Ogden man has wired his acceptance of the commission and will report to Fort Douglas about October 1, where he will receive his instructions.

Captain Noggle entered the army service in Hawaii soon after the United States entered the great war. He was assigned to the North Island aviation field near San Diego and there became one of the aviation service's leading instructors. He was assigned to foreign service later in the war and held important positions in France during the latter part of the conflict. Returning to this country after the armistice, he remained for some time in the army and then retired, coming to Ogden to be with his relatives. Recently he has been connected with the inspection service of the National Camera association.

The Ogden man says that he has no information as to where he may be assigned in the army service. Aviators of experience are desired for army duty not only in the United States but at various insular possessions, including the Philippines.

HAMPTON TAKEN TO UTAH PRISON

Convicted Forger Goes to Salt Lake to Begin Indeterminate Sentence

Walter M. Hampton, former book-keeper for the Golden Rule store here, who was sentenced to the state prison for a term of from one to twenty years by Judge A. E. Pratt of August 16, after conviction by jury of the crime of forgery was taken from the county jail yesterday afternoon and placed in the Utah state penitentiary.

Deputy Sheriff Joseph Chadwick took the prisoner to Salt Lake. Hampton was found guilty of filling in and endorsing two company checks for \$100 and \$500 respectively. He requested a stay of execution pending the filing of a motion for a new trial. Yesterday Hampton's attorney withdrew the motion and the man was ordered taken to the prison to begin his sentence.

Hampton has made application for parole which is now in the hands of the state board of pardons.

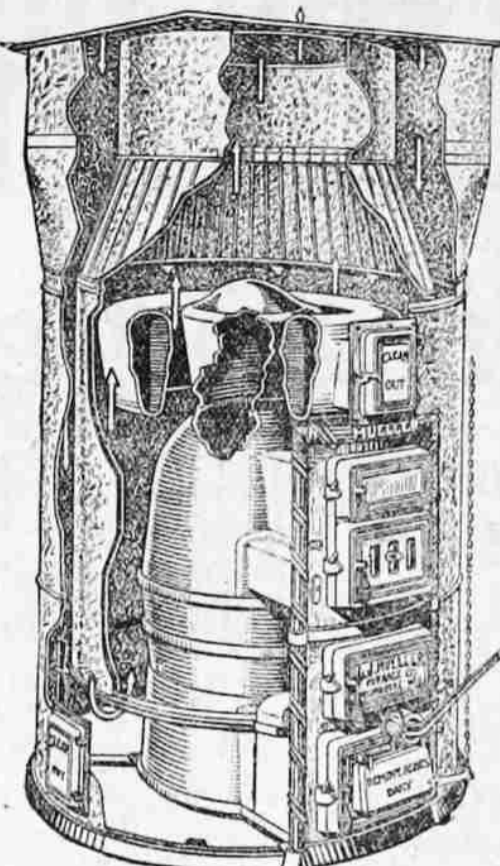

OLD BATTLESHIP GUIDED BY RADIO WAVES ALONE

WASHINGTON, Sept. 18.—Tests of radio control installation on the old battleship Iowa, concluded by the navy department, were declared today to have fulfilled highest expectations. The 12,000-ton battleship was navigated with accuracy, it was said, by means of radio waves emanating from a control station on the battleship Ohio. The control was found efficient up to ten or twelve miles.

Plans are being made to use the Iowa in target practice for the Atlantic fleet. It will be the first time that a battleship moving under full speed has thus been used.

FUNDS BELIEVED STOLEN RESTORED BY WOMAN

SAN FRANCISCO, Sept. 18.—A shoe box containing \$10,000 in currency was received through the mails here by Mrs. Charles Hayes, wife of a former chauffeur of the Anglo and London Paris national bank, who dropped from sight September 8, simultaneously with the disappearance of a bank automobile containing \$50,000 in currency and bonds. The box was post-marked New Orleans.

Mrs. Hayes turned box and money over to the police.
