Cutsups and "relishes" do much to give piquancy to certain dishes. TOMATO CATSUP: 1-2 bushel ripe tomatoes, 3 tablespoons salt, 1 tablespoon black pepper, 1-2 teaspoon red pepper, 1 cup brown sugar, 1 cup vinegar, 2 tablespoons cinnamon, 1 tablespoon cloves, 1-2 cup sugar, 2-3 cups vinegar, 1 tablespoon salt, 2 teaspoon cinnamon, 1 teaspoon allspice, 1 teaspoon cloves, 15 ripe tomatoes, 5 onions, 2 green peppers, 1-2 cup sugar, 2-3 cups vinegar, 1 tablespoon salt, 2 teaspoon cinnamon, 1 teaspoon allspice, 1 teaspoon cloves. Chili Sauce may take the place of catsup many times and is much easier to make. CHILI SAUCE: 15 ripe tomatoes, 5 onions, 2 green peppers, 1-2 cup sugar, 2-3 cups vinegar, 1 tablespoon salt, 2 teaspoon cinnamon, 1 teaspoon allspice, 1 teaspoon cloves. Peel tomatoes and slice. Chop peppers and onions. Put in preserving kettle with vinegar, sugar and spices. Bring gradually to the boiling point and cook slowly until thick, about two or three hours. Seal in sterilized jars. A good housewife makes time when she can't find it.

UNCLE WIGGLY AND THE TREE HOUSE.

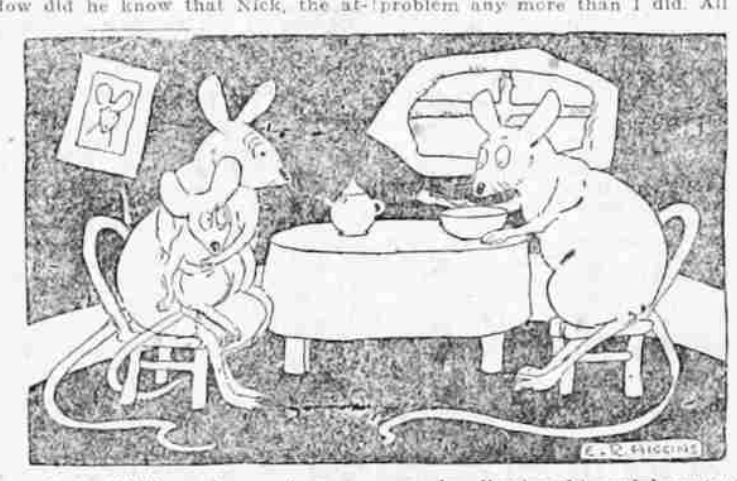

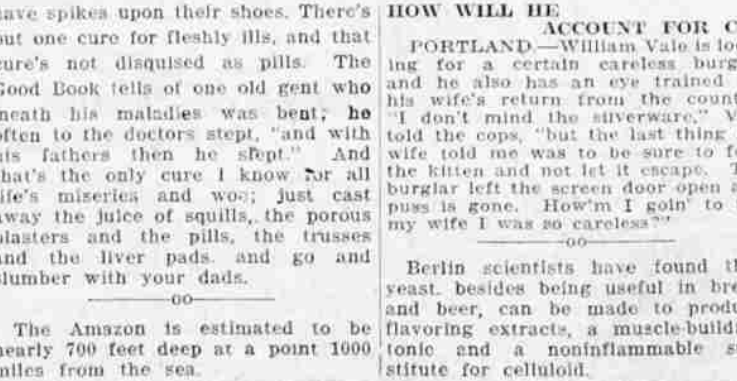
