BRITISH ANTHEM STIRS N. Y. RIOT

Pilgrim Celebration Held at Carnegie Hall Breaks Up in Disorder

NEW YORK, Sept. 30.—Police were called to Carnegie Hall last night to clear a crowd of men and women who forced their way into the building during the tercentenary celebration of the landing of the Pilgrims.

A group of women who said they were members of an organization known as "The American Women Pickets for the Enforcement of America's War Aims" led the intruders.

The disturbance reached such proportions that it was impossible for the speakers to continue and it was decided to adjourn.

When the music stopped, Sampel Gompers tried to speak but his voice was drowned in the uproar and he gave up the attempt.

Secretary of State Coby was scheduled to speak but he had not arrived when the disturbance began.

Members of the chorus gathered in front of the auditorium after the meeting and sang "America," led by some of the picket leaders.

Some of the girls said they had been asked to sing at the meeting last night and consented. They attended rehearsal, they added, and did not know that the British anthem was to be sung.

Under normal conditions the company employs 4,500 men and women.

The laying off of men at the plant began several weeks ago and the number of workers has been dwindling gradually.

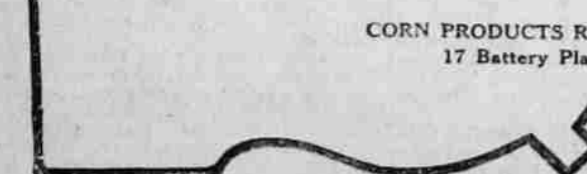
