Fire Chief Graves Urges Co-operation of Ogden Citizens in Prevention of Conflagrations

October 9, the anniversary of the great fire in Chicago, has been adopted as Fire Prevention day throughout the entire country and is observed by all up-to-date fire departments in the United States. But more attention is paid to this day in the west than in the east as the eastern cities are older and the systems of cleaning the eastern cities have reached near-perfection. The small cities of the west have "annual clean-ups" and one of the objects of the strong fire prevention movement in the west is to create the spirit for daily cleanups, thereby keeping the city clean all of the time.

Thomas H. Ince, of the Ince Motion Picture company in California, has offered a prize for the western city making the best showing for the year. The city of Ogden is entered in this contest. Our system of inspections, with the assistance of the Boy Scouts who have fire badges presented by the municipality, is of material assistance in this campaign and we are making a good showing. Last year we had 254 alarms from January 1 to October 1. This year we had 120 alarms to October 1 and our losses have been very small. The month of September this year we had only nine alarms, the smallest number for any month in the past five years.

Property owners in the United States are becoming better acquainted each year with Fire Prevention day and its origin and purpose. But do they avail themselves of the knowledge and put into practice the lessons which the day is supposed to teach? Unapplied knowledge is useless. Hands and eyes that do not co-ordinate in the removal of fire hazards are worthless, so far as fire prevention is concerned.

The greater number of our fires are caused by carelessness and we urge the people of this city to develop a sentiment of personal responsibility toward the elimination of preventable fires and in favor of fire prevention. The instruction of all the people of our city in fire prevention is a very large order for the twenty-five men of the Ogden City fire department. But by keeping constantly at it we are gaining every year and we ask every citizen to help us in our work. It means the saving of homes, of business blocks, of factories, or public institutions, a saving that will be of benefit to the entire community and to each individual as well.

There will be a demonstration of the working of the fire alarm system at the corner of Twenty-fourth street and Washington avenue showing both the sending and receiving of a fire alarm and at 2 o'clock on October 9 a demonstration by the entire fire department of the city.

SUGAR GROWER WON MILLIONS

PARIS, Sept. 20.—(Correspondence.)—Millions of francs were won and lost across and baccarat tables and the roulette wheels in a frenzy of gambling for stakes hitherto unknown in France during the season which is drawing to a close at Deauville.

Foreigners have been conspicuous in keeping the proprietors busy passing stakes over the green carpets. Mr. Vaghiano, a Greek ship owner, according to L'Evening won 2,600,000 francs at baccarat in a sitting of three hours and a half at Deauville recently. On the other hand, an American, whom the newspaper refers to as the "Tobacco King" is said to have dropped 1,500,000 francs between midnight and daybreak one night during the past week.

over \$100,000," he is reported to have told a consoling piker. But, the most extraordinary player of them all is a young Cuban, a sugar grower of Havana, who is said to have won about 5,000,000 francs after losing 2,500,000 in August. INSURANCE NOT ALL INCLUSIVE

Some Losses Cannot Be Made Good After Blaze Is Over

Although fire insurance is one of the great precautionary measures that can be taken to prevent huge fire losses, it can not and does not completely cover all losses sustained, according to fire insurance men, who are taking an active interest in Fire Prevention Week.

NOT COMPLETE PROTECTION. "Fire insurance is a great precaution against heavy losses or losses of any kind," said one of the Ogden fire insurance agents this morning. "However, it can not be considered complete protection. In no case can all the losses be offset by fire insurance. It will provide payment for the actual property loss sustained but that will not offset the loss of time, of labor and of money to renew business, to re-new a home, to rebuild a business of any kind."

NEED PREVENTION. "Combined with fire insurance, as the final safeguard against complete fire loss, there should also be fire prevention work. Both work hand in hand for the safety of the people. At a time when building material is high when labor is none too plentiful, when buildings are needed, there seems to be even more reason than ever to prevent fire losses. Ogden has had a splendid record during the past nine months, it would be well to continue to improve that record with minimum fire losses for the benefit of the entire city."

CHILDREN HELP PREVENT FIRES

City's Apparatus and Alarm System to Be Demonstrated On Saturday

United efforts of the federal, state and city governments, as well as of insurance companies and agents, are being made for fire protection, the Fire Prevention Week of October 4 to 9, proclamations having been issued by President Wilson, Governor Hamber-seker and Mayor Francis.

SUPPORT OF CHILDREN. In Ogden, the campaign is being made with the co-operation of the fire department, the Boy Scouts and the school children for special attention is being called in the various schools to the methods that can be pursued to prevent fires. At the same time, the children will be urged to use utmost diligence in reporting any condition that they might think would cause a fire and to report even the minor blazes that seem to endanger property.

SATURDAY LEADING DAY. The special observance of the week will be on Saturday, October 9, the anniversary of the great Chicago fire. On that day there will be a showing of Ogden's fire fighting equipment and a demonstration of the ways that fire alarms are sent from alarm boxes and received at the department stations. This demonstration is being arranged by Fire Chief Graves, with the approval of the city commission.

CARELESSNESS LEADS TO FIRES


Salt Lake Chief Points Out Waste Caused in Single Year

SALT LAKE, Oct. 6.—According to Fire Chief Bywater, of the 142 fires in Salt Lake during July, ninety-four were due to carelessness. The fire chief made this statement in two talks at theatres last night, when calling attention to Fire Prevention Week.

The chief asserted that the local board of commissioners has done everything to equip the Salt Lake fire department to the highest possible standard, but that the co-operation of all citizens is necessary to eliminate the losses in life and property due to fires.

The chief called attention to the fact that this week is being observed as Fire Prevention Week by a proclamation of the president of the United States, the governor of Utah and the mayor of Salt Lake City. "Measures toward fire prevention, however, should not be confined to one week," he said. "To effectively combat the preventable conflagrations that occur in this country every day, the matter should be kept constantly before the people. The department is doing all in its power to check fires in Salt Lake City, and during the first six months of this year 5000 buildings were inspected as a precautionary measure."

"One is amazed to hear that 20,000 lives are lost in the United States every year through fires, and a large percent of those fires are absolutely pre-

MAYOR'S PROCLAMATION

Whereas, a large percentage of the fires causing great waste may be easily prevented by increased care and vigilance on the part of our citizens;

Therefore, I, Frank Francis, mayor of Ogden, do designate and set apart Saturday, October 9, as Fire Prevention Day, and request the citizens of this city to plan for that day such instructive and educational exercises as shall bring before the people the serious effects of the fire waste and the need of their individual and collective efforts in conserving our resources. I especially urge the schools to observe the day with fitting programs.

In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and caused the seal of the City of Ogden to be affixed."

COAL SHORTAGE FELT BY SHIPS ON PACIFIC

HONOLULU, T. H., Sept. 21.—(Correspondence.)—Shortage of coal at Panama threatens to divert vessels bound through the canal to the Orient via Honolulu to San Diego and San Francisco for fuel and supplies, according to a letter received by the Honolulu chamber of commerce from Panama.

The chamber has instructed its representative at Washington to take up the matter with the proper authorities here to the end that ships may be fully fueled at Panama and permitted to continue on their regular route to the Far East by way of Honolulu.
