Ogden Livestock and poultry raisers took awards yesterday in exhibits at the Utah state fair and additional ribbons are expected when the remaining entries have been judged.

LARGE ATTENDANCE

The attendance yesterday was reported as largely increased with the continued fair weather and the virtual completion of the arrangements of displays. Each day is bringing to the city an ever swelling tide of conference visitors and should the weather prevail throughout the week a record attendance is expected.

TEACHERS GET CERTIFICATES

State Board of Education Approves Plan; Budget Divided

School certificates were granted yesterday at a meeting of the state board of education to several Ogden men and women. Many important features to the school program in Utah were decided at the meeting.

HEALTH REQUIREMENTS

The board adopted the recommendations of Dr. E. G. Gowen, state director of health education, who enumerated the following as minimum requirements: Physical examination of all elementary and junior high school pupils at least once during the year.

TOTAL OF \$5000 PAID

In making a division of available funds for the present school year, the board found that \$10,495.26 had been paid to school districts during the past year, and it provided an additional \$10,000 for the current school year.

BUDGET IS DIVIDED

At the meeting of the governor, the state board made up the budget for the coming biennium, by asking for \$161,200, instead of the \$137,100 provided for the current biennium, now drawing to a close.
