AUTO RAGER IS KILLED AT FAIR CONFERENCE TO OPEN ON FRIDAY

Elko Man Meets Doom When Machine Throws Front Tire

SALT LAKE, Oct. 7.—In a spectacular accident yesterday afternoon at the state fair grounds, Eugene Gouzeva, a racing driver from Elko, Nev., was killed, when his machine, a Chevrolet, threw a right front tire and struck completely over the top of the driver.
