OIL TANK BLAST ON STEAMER KILLS 4, WOUNDS MANY. NEW YORK, Oct. 7.—An oil tank aboard the British steamer G. R. Crowe, tied up for repairs in Sheepshead Bay dock in Brooklyn, exploded early this afternoon while approximately 100 men were working on the craft. An hour after the explosion four bodies had been recovered. A hasty check-up of workers showed four more missing. The number of injured was placed between 20 and 30. Earlier police reports had a dozen killed. Red Cross workers and ambulances were rushed to the scene.

G. O. P. HAS HARD ROW IN OKLAHOMA

Sullivan Thinks Republican Optimism Is Not Justified by Conditions

BY MARK SULLIVAN. TULSA, Okla., Oct. 7.—Harding is coming into this state Saturday. His purpose is to clinch the Republican effort to win a senatorship from the Democrats. He may succeed. But when you have said he may succeed you have gone as far as even the most optimistic Republican likes to hope. There is a serious situation among the Democrats which, together with some other factors, may endanger the Democratic senatorial candidate, but omitting the senatorial situation, when you look to the future, there is no reason to expect that Oklahoma will go otherwise than normal. And in Oklahoma "normal" means a Democratic majority of anywhere from 40,000 upward.

organizing to vote for the Republican candidate. In the part of Oklahoma that is sometimes called "Little Dixie," there are many old-fashioned southerners, whose traditions go back to state rights. An old-fashioned hard-sell state-righter, who is unimpaired by Gore with the idea that the length means surrender of sovereignty and has become "set" in that idea, is hard to change. Many of these are of the opinion that just Tam Watson in Gore's brief service in congress he attracted attention by being one of the Republican members who voted to disloyalty the Wilson Democrats. Victor Berger, when he was under charges of disloyalty. That vote might have been more recent if it might have been stronger in principle. Probably it was more nearly the latter. Nobody thinks of Harrell as a radical or Socialist though his action will get him much of the Socialist vote.

Another factor relied on by the Republicans to help them in the senatorial fight and a lesser extent in the presidential regime in the state government because of Jordan scandals together with that general discontent against the national administration which occasionally express itself in the words "damn Wilson, anyhow."

Similarly two factors work against the Republicans. One is the negro question. Oklahoma is a southern state with separate railroad cars and stations for negroes. Some of Harding's utterances have tended to revive sensitiveness about the color line. Also some of the activities of the Republican national committee in Oklahoma during the present campaign have not commended themselves even to many who are Republicans.

U. S. TREASURY MAY HOLD RAIL FUNDS FOR ACCOUNTING.
