

COX WELCOMES LEAGUE ISSUE

Harding's Opposition to World Scheme Approved By Idaho Senator

NASHVILLE, Tenn., Oct. 8.—Governor Cox of Ohio, formally accepted last night the league of nations issue as stated by Senator Harding, his Republican opponent. Referring to the senator's Des Moines speech, denouncing the present league, Governor Cox declared in an address:

"Now he's against the league," "in for the league."

DEFINITELY STATED
"Not until today," said the governor, "was it definitely known what the position of the senatorial candidate was on the league."

Declaring that he had asked audiences all through the west if they would give Senator Harding's position on the league, the governor continued:

"Today in response to my questions, he came out unreservedly against the league. Evidently he had heard from Brother Borah."

ENDORSED BY BORAH
HARTFORD, Conn., Oct. 8.—Senator William E. Borah of Idaho, in two addresses here, last night gave his complete endorsement of Senator Harding's Des Moines address in which the Republican presidential nominee definitely declared himself against the league of nations.

"One thing is certain," he said, "if you had read the speech delivered by Senator Harding today in the great state of Iowa, you would know that so far as Senator Harding is concerned, he will never give his influence as president of the United States to join any league which impairs in the slightest the independence of the sovereignty of the American republic."

ROOSEVELT'S COMMENT
DENVER, Colo., Oct. 8.—Franklin D. Roosevelt, Democratic candidate for vice president, in an address here last night, declared that he welcomed Senator Harding's declaration opposing the entrance of the United States into the league of nations.

"A great weight has been lifted from my shoulders," declared Mr. Roosevelt. "I have been honestly searching for a declaration from Mr. Harding which would definitely accept or reject the league of nations. Until now I have been able to find only answers which sought on the one hand to hold Senator Harding and on the other to hold former President Taft. But in tonight's newspapers, Senator Harding is quoted as saying that he is opposed to the league. Mr. Roosevelt then read newspaper articles containing the quotation:

"Now the die is cast," he continued, "and we accept with cheerfulness and confidence the league of nations."

HAYS ASKS LIGHT ON PROMISES MADE EUROPE
NEW YORK, Oct. 8.—According to a recent request by Chairman White of the Democratic national committee, Will H. Hays, Republican national chairman, wrote Mr. Hays today that he and the Republican organization would "be glad" to help distribute the text of the league of nations covenant.

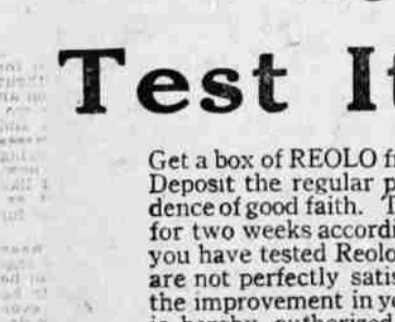
Mr. Hays said he also would favor disseminating the text of reservations proposed by Senator Lodge.

Mr. Hays's letter in part follows:

"To acquaint the voters of the country with the facts about the Wilson league of nations has been the earnest effort of the Republican organization ever since the administration took over the cables which kept the country from knowing anything about the development of the covenant. We will of course be glad to do anything further possible with you or separately as we are doing, to that end."

"May I further suggest, that we make an effort in some way to ascertain and advise the country just what the president promised Europe that this country would do, which may not be in the text of the covenant. You'll find out just what this was, and let us give that to the country also. Governor Cox has promised to make good these pledges wherever they may be."

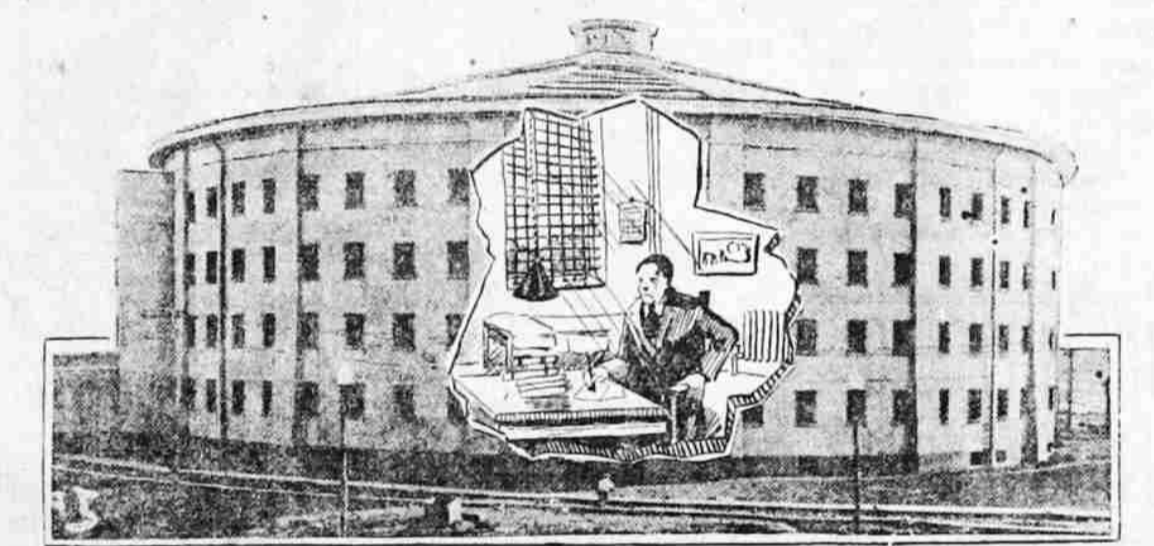

NEW ILLINOIS PENITENTIARY MODEL PRISON



STATEVILLE, Ill.—Penologists from all parts of the United States and from other countries are visiting the new Illinois state penitentiary, nearing completion, which is considered a model prison. The buildings are reinforced concrete and are fire proof. The dormitory of the cellhouse is circular and every cell has hot and cold water, toilet, electric light, bed, table and chair. A single guard in the center of the prison ground controls the locking and lighting of all the cells. There are eight cellhouses with 248 cells each. Sixty-four acres in the center of the prison farm are enclosed by a concrete wall.

pear was put on the wider and more easily maintained excuse of "a previous engagement."

Undoubtedly many Democrats who follow Reed's leadership are with him against the league of nations and against Wilson and Cox because of the league. Many of them are of the group that politicians speak of as "The Irish Vote." Nobody dreams that Reed will recant, either publicly or privately, but some Democratic leaders entertain the hope that some time before the election Reed can be persuaded to pass the word quietly around among his followers that even in spite of the league it's best to stay with the party.

The Republicans have here the task of defending a senatorship. Senator Spencer is in his favor all the prestige that a sitting senator acquired by minute devotion to his constituents' affairs at Washington. The Democrat who is trying to take the seat away from Spencer is Breckenridge Long, formerly an assistant secretary of state.

Long's personality is not especially outstanding and, except for the league of nations, there are no outstanding issues. The Democrats have in their favor the fact that the present Democratic governor and the rest of the Democratic state administration has made a very good record.

All in all, the Missouri result would not seem at this moment likely to vary much from normal. So far as there is any variation it is in favor of the Republicans.
