WARSAW, Oct. 15.—(By the Associated Press.)—General Zeligowski, head of the new government formed at Vilna after its recent occupation by his troops, has sent the old Lithuanian government at Kovno an ultimatum demanding that all the Lithuanian troops be withdrawn twenty kilometers to the west of the Varna-Grand railway. The ultimatum contained a 24 hour time limit.

WILSON ASKS GOVERNOR TO SEND IN FACTS

Allen of Kansas Requested to Furnish Evidence of Unfair Practice

EXECUTIVE ANSWERS APPEAL FROM MANY FARM BUREAU FEDERATION TO ISSUE STATEMENT ON GRAIN MARKET

WASHINGTON, Oct. 15.—President Wilson has requested Governor Allen, of Kansas, to forward to the federal trade commission any information he has regarding the recent decline in wheat prices due to unfair practices or competition or to other artificial causes.

A letter to this effect sent today by Secretary Tumulty was in answer to many appeals for government action looking to an embargo on Canadian wheat. These were referred something ago to the commission and the department of agriculture. Mr. Tumulty's letter to Governor Allen said:

STATEMENT PLANNED. CHICAGO, Oct. 15.—Decision to issue a statement explaining to farmers of grain growing states the situation in the wheat market was reached at a meeting today of the executive committee of the American Farm Bureau federation. The statement, the committee announced, would point out the cause of the shortage, the effect on the harvest and would urge that exports be curbed.

UNDER CONSUMPTION. "This is 100,000,000 bushels under America's normal consumption," Mr. Howard said. "There is no secret in the grain trade that conditions of supply and demand justify a price of at least \$2 and possibly \$2 a bushel for wheat and the present demoralized condition of the grain market is largely due to manipulations and propaganda by large speculators who sold tremendous quantities of wheat abroad in June and July at prices then prevailing and who are now trying to fill these orders at prices that will net them an extraordinary margin. One of the large packing houses is known to hold huge contracts for export grain and has been interested in seeing the market 'bend down'."

PRICE TAKES JUMP. CHICAGO, Oct. 15.—Wheat made a big advance in price today after news became public that President Wilson had asked Governor Allen of Kansas for information which might indicate that the recent big fall in the value of wheat was due to any artificial cause. The price of No. 1 hard winter wheat advanced from \$1.15 to \$1.21, and closed unsettled at \$1.17 1/2 to \$1.21 1/2.

UNION WITH GERMAN RADICALS PROPOSED

HALLE, Germany, Oct. 13.—By the Associated Press.—For fully 4 hours tonight M. Zinovieff, chairman of the executive committee of the third international and one of the four big chiefs of the soviet Russia, pleaded with the independent Socialists at their convention here to join with Moscow, create a revolution in Germany and help carry out the proletarian program for a world revolution.

PERIOD OF CONFUSION. M. Zinovieff proceeded this statement by announcing that the central committee of the third international had authorized him to state that it was prepared to enter into negotiations with the "German comrades." This announcement made in the course of a four-hour discussion of the aims of the third international and the conditions under which the Moscow regime would permit a union with the German radicals created a sensation and brought the warring factions in the convention to their feet. A period of confusion lasting several minutes followed before the speaker was able to resume.

WILL ORDER STRIKE.
