WALL ST. LIST MOVES UPWARD

General Advances Scored Despite Higher Money and Exchange Weakness

NEW YORK, Oct. 15.—Foreign petroleum was the only noteworthy exception to the higher trend of prices at the active opening of today's stock market, the general list making variable advances on a short covering. Bethlehem and Crucible Steels, Baldwin & American Locomotives, Stromberg-Carlson, Barrett company, Central Leather and Hide and Leather preferred, comprised the former issues with such rails as Union Pacific Nickel Plate and Reading second preferred. Heaviness of loyal Dutch and Shell Transport, which opened at losses of a point, was attributed to more unsettledness in the Dutch markets.

Regardless of the 9 per cent opening and renewal rate for call money and the weakness of foreign exchange, induced largely by the threatened strike of the British coal miners, the market made further upward progress during the morning. Buying of leading issues and points attracted considerable attention, other rails rising 1 to 2 points. Oils recovered much of their early loss under leadership of the Mexican group, and motors, metals and equipments, shippings, tobacco leathers and chemicals advanced 2 to 3 points. Sears Roebuck was conspicuous for its contrary movement, declining 3 points.

Rails extended their gains at midday when call money dropped to 8 1/2 per cent. Delaware, Lackawanna and Western advanced six points, and Delaware and Hudson, New York Central, Northern Pacific and Atchafalpa rose 1 1/2.
