

WASTE IN WAR SURPLUS DENIED

Department's Statement of Salvage Answered By Republicans

WASHINGTON, Nov. 1.—The war department Sunday answered charges that the government had sustained great loss through the sale of surplus war supplies with the claim that it had "saved over \$4,675,342,881.13 to the taxpayers."

The statement said that had the war "continued another year the supplies on hand at the signing of the armistice would have been totally inadequate."

As to the settlement of claims, "including both formal and informal contracts terminated by reason of the cessation of hostilities," the statement said the total amount of such claims or the value of the uncompleted portion of the contracts amounted to \$3,306,534,411.22 and that the basis on which the settlement of these claims had been made by the claims board had "resulted in a net saving to the government of \$2,823,035,237.91."

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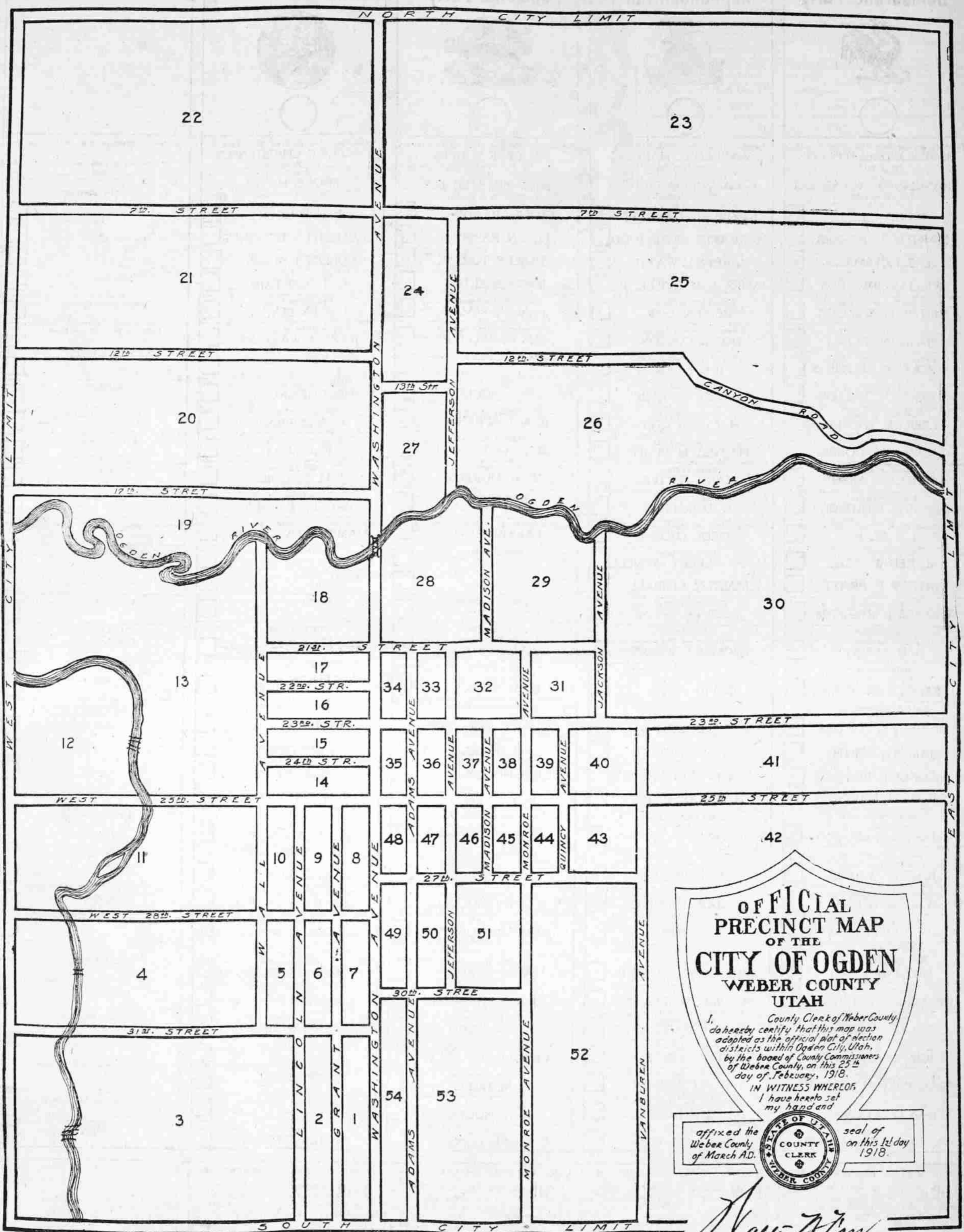
