CERTIFICATES OF SERVICE ARRIVE

Papers Issued by State Available to Veterans Upon Request

Certificates of service for men of Weber county who served in the army, navy or marine corps during the world war, have arrived in Ogden and are being distributed through J. C. Littlefield, adjutant of the American Legion. The certificates, each signed personally by Governor Simon Bamberger and containing the engraved tributes to the man who served, number 1800 and are now ready for the ex-soldiers who can obtain them by calling at Mr. Littlefield's office in the city hall.

The name of each man who served in any branch of the military force or naval force has been engraved upon the individual certificates which carry the expressions of gratitude of the state of Utah for the service of the soldiers and sailors.

On each certificate is the engraved emblem of the state and with the signature of Governor Bamberger, the official state seal is pasted. Each certificate contains the following words: "The State of Utah, in grateful acknowledgment of the sacrifices and devoted services of her sons in the military and naval forces of the United States during the war with Germany and her allies, issues this certificate in the name of soldier's full name, as a testimonial of his valor and fidelity and patriotic service in the great world conflict for the preservation of liberty, popular government and civilization." Given at Salt Lake this 13th day of November, 1920, by virtue of an act of the legislature of the State of Utah, approved March 29, 1917.

Men of Weber county can obtain their certificates from Mr. Littlefield, with the exception of soldiers in Ogden valley, who should procure them from A. P. Renstrom, adjutant of the American Legion post in Hunteville. The certificates for the men in the Hunteville district were sent to Mr. Renstrom today.

FOR THOSE WHO DIED

For the men who died in service, the certificate will go to the nearest kin. These certificates contain a gold star, but otherwise are the same as the others.

Mr. Littlefield urges that the former soldiers of Weber county call for their certificates at once. All that will be necessary in obtaining them is to give the name and the certificate has been placed in alphabetical order so they may be immediately found.

The certificate of Private Frank Isakson, who served with Battery B of the 143th field artillery, and who died in France, contains the gold star.

Funeral services for Private Isakson are to be held in the Fourth ward chapel Sunday at 12:15 o'clock. The soldier's body arrived in Ogden yesterday from France.

FINED \$60 FOR STRIKING GIRL

Arthur Walker Says the Girl Ran Into His Hand

Because Lola Richardson declined to dance with him, Arthur Walker struck her, the girl told Judge D. H. Roberts in the city court this morning. He was fined \$60.

Walker was arraigned following his arrest at a local dance hall with a man who gave his name as Frank Terry. Terry was discharged on recommendation of City Attorney Sam Powell who said that developments indicated that Terry went to the girl's rescue following the alleged attack and a fight followed.

Walker denied the charges. He said he asked the girl, whom he did not know personally, for a dance. She refused, he said.

"Then put my hand out in front of me and she ran into it," Walker said.
