

LODGE REFUSES CABINET PLACE

Senator New of Indiana Also Prefers to Work on Legislative Subjects

WASHINGTON, Dec. 3.—(By the Associated Press) — Elimination of the Senator Lodge of Massachusetts and Senator New of Indiana, as prospective officers of President-elect Harding's cabinet was reported to be a definite development of the visit here Thursday of Harry N. Daugherty of Ohio, friend and advisor of the president-elect.

Mr. Daugherty conferred with a number of prominent Republicans, including Senators Lodge and New. There was no announcement of the subjects or results of the conference, but close friends of the two senators said they both had advised Mr. Daugherty that they desired no cabinet preference, believing that they could perform better service for President Harding and their party by remaining in the senate.
