

# OBREGON WAITS MAYO RETIRES FOR RECOGNITION FROM NAVY RANK

### Will Let His Achievements in Mexico Justify U. S. Approval Rear Admiral Ends Service of 47 Years With Highest of Record

MEXICO CITY, Dec. 9.—Efforts to obtain recognition by the United States of the Obregon regime in Mexico will not be carried on as actively as they were under the administration of Adolfo de la Huerta, it is indicated here. It is declared he is inclined to allow his administration during the next few months to act as his appeal for recognition. An indication that recognition by the United States is not far away, it is asserted, is the absence of Alberto J. Pani from the Obregon cabinet. It is understood the former Mexican minister to France is the new president's choice for an eventual representative in Washington. The fact that within the past few days Japan, Germany, the Netherlands have recognized Mexico has aroused only mild newspaper comment. Several journals have urged editorially the recognition by the United States, asserting that would mean similar action by all the European powers. President Obregon spent the most of his first week in official life at home recuperating from the strenuous program of the inauguration. He is following a rigid program of diet and exercise. General Benjamin Hill, secretary of war, is also ill and it is believed he will leave soon for Los Angeles, Cal., where he will receive treatment.

WASHINGTON, Dec. 9.—Rear Admiral H. T. Mayo, wartime commander of the United States fleet, goes on the retired list of the navy today, after more than 47 years of service. He has the distinction of having served continuously in a flag command longer than any other rear admiral on the list. Prior to and during the war with Germany, Admiral Mayo had charge of the training of nearly half a million men and his command included the protection of most of the American soldiers sent to France. Nearly 30 years of Admiral Mayo's long service have been spent at sea. His record showing 17 years of shore duty. Since his relief as commander-in-chief of the fleet, he has been a member of the general board and now is senior member of the Haitian court of inquiry. He will continue on active service until the court has been discharged, it was said at the navy department and probably will remain a member of the general board.

## WEST VIRGINIA GOVERNOR WILL STOP STRIKE RIOTS

NEW YORK, Dec. 9.—Gov. J. J. Cornwall, of West Virginia, speaking to the members of the Southern society, declared order is going to be restored in the disturbed mining regions of the state "if it takes every man we can throw in West Virginia and the United States army in the bargain." Describing the conditions in Mingo county, the governor said it was true that there have been forty or fifty deaths and a number of people have been beaten. "The sheriff's office," he added, "became the headquarters of the United Mine Workers," and the town was "full of agitators." "If John L. Lewis wants the respect of the people for his union," the governor said, "he has got to cut out the rough stuff."

## NEW RECORD FOR SAVING LIFE AND VESSELS MADE

WASHINGTON, Dec. 9.—New records in saving life and assisting distressed vessels were set by the coast guard during the past fiscal year, said the annual report of Commandant W. E. Reynolds, made public today. Rescues aggregated 2417. Vessels and cargoes valued at \$62,170,702 were assisted as against \$29,000,000 in any preceding year, and 691 craft were seized for law violations. Strong opposition to merging the coast guard into the naval establishment as proposed last year by Secretary Daniels is expressed in the report.

## N. Y. CENTRAL CLOSES SHOPS; 500 MEN IDLE

TOLEDO, O., Dec. 9.—Closing of the Campbell shops of the New York Central Railroad company on December 16 was announced by George F. Wilson, general shop foreman here. The announcement said that the closing will be involuntary for more than 500 men will be out of work as the result.

## WEALTHY INDIAN MAY KEEP BRIDE

Guardian Sought Custody of Aged Man; Says Woman Kidnaped Him

TOPEKA, Kan., Dec. 9.—The suit by which the guardian of Jackson Barnett, aged millionaire Indian, sought custody of his ward and his separation from his bride was dismissed Wednesday. The action was dismissed after Geo. J. O'Hara, of Henrietta, Okla., the guardian, had paid the costs in the case amounting to \$1200. An agreement was reached several months ago by O'Hara and Mrs. Barnett by which Mrs. Barnett agreed to go back to Oklahoma with her husband and the guardian agreed not to interfere with their married life. Mrs. Barnett, then known as Mrs. Anna Paula Laws, and Barnett were married at Coffeyville, Kan., on February 24, 1919, and remained there for two weeks. The guardian claimed that the woman had kidnaped his ward and was holding him a prisoner.

## JAPAN LOSES IN RACE FOR NAVAL LEADERSHIP

LONDON, Dec. 9.—Vice Admiral Baron Sadakichi Kato, chief of the Japanese naval board of education, interviewed by the correspondent of the London Times in Tokio, said Japan was unable, because of financial and technical reasons, to equal the naval achievements of the leading maritime powers. Baron Kato declared Japan can not build more than the eight capital ships authorized by the last regular diet, but it was intended that this should equal, vessel for vessel, those of other powers and hence the construction of the largest types. The baron said he hoped armaments everywhere would be reduced.

## ITALIAN SEAMEN SEIZE WARSHIP

### Crew of 'Sub' Chaser Attacks Leaders. Desert Fleet for D'Annunzio

LONDON, Dec. 9.—Officers of the Italian submarine chaser 59-PN were treacherously attacked, bound and gagged by their crew and then placed in a boat which took them into the harbor of Fiume, says a Milan dispatch to the London Times describing the desertion of the vessel from the blockading fleet along the Dalmatian coast. When the boat landed, it was met by Suptain Gabriel d'Annunzio, who gave the men a cordial reception and made an address in which he denounced as a traitor Admiral Mito, in command of Italian naval forces in the Adriatic. Members of the d'Annunzio legionaries were asked to kneel before the deserters, because their action had "saved the honor of the Italian navy," it is said, the poet-soldier setting an example by kneeling.

## HOOVER PLEADS FOR TINY WAIFS

### "Take an Invisible Guest in Home at Christmas" Basis of His Plan

MINNEAPOLIS, Dec. 9.—Herbert Hoover, former federal food administrator, told an audience here last night that should America abandon its charity and relief work in eastern and central Europe before 3,500,000 children have been tided over the wave of famine and the next harvest gathered, ascendancy of Bolshevism in both enemy and friendly countries would result. "Take an invisible guest into your home at Christmas time," was his appeal. "We must have 25,000,000 for these little waifs, under-nourished or orphaned children—\$10,000,000 for medical supplies and the balance for food and clothing." Mr. Hoover said 5,500,000 children had been served directly after the armistice, but as conditions become

more normal the burden on America grows less. The plan for an "invisible guest" calls for an empty chair at each table, symbolic of one or more child lives saved at \$10 a piece by the families who play host.
