May Set Aside Bear River Bay for Birds

The biennial report of R. H. Siddoway, filed with Governor Hamberger yesterday, indicates that a large area of government land may be set aside in the Bear River bay district as a preserve for migratory birds.

Mr. Siddoway's report shows that the fish and game condition of the state is in good condition. The government fish hatchery has been enlarged during the year to double its former capacity and is now capable of caring for 2,000,000 eggs.

Winter Weather Slows Up Utah Farm Work

There will be but little more farm work throughout the state this year says the weekly report of J. Cecil Altner, state meteorologist, which follows: "Wintery weather is slowly terminating farm work over the state, though some plowing is still being done, and there are many threshing machines busy. Fall sown grain is going into the winter in fine condition, and the winter livestock ranges generally offer an abundance of feed. Light precipitation this week, mostly snow, was fairly general over the state, affording ample moisture for stock on most of the desert ranges; though in the southern counties and on the adjacent Arizona strip, moisture supplies are scarce, limiting the range considerably; otherwise, cattle and sheep are doing well. Farm work has stopped at Levan, the ground being frozen and under two inches of snow. Five inches of snow fell at Kanosh, and the ground has frozen considerably, though some plowing is done in the afternoon. Snow is ample in the hills for stock at Black Rock, and the range feed has improved at Milford. Grazing is unsatisfactory around Modena because of moisture shortage, which necessitates driving stock to water; these conditions with the unusual weather have been extra hard on stock. Snow is one inch deep at Maui. Stock in Carbon county is in excellent condition, the ranges being open and feed plentiful; some sugar beets are still in the field. Grain has been threshed, though alfalfa seed is still in the stack. Highways—Keltion, medium; Tooele, to Grantsville, good. Salt Lake City, fair; Grantsville, dry but rough. Levan, good; Kanosh, fairly good; Deseret, fair; Big Spring, improved. Modena, good; St. George, good; Hiawatha, fine, being worked; Castle Dale, excellent; Emery, getting rough and dusty; Duchesne, fine; Moab, good.

Methodist Men's Club Entertains at Dinner

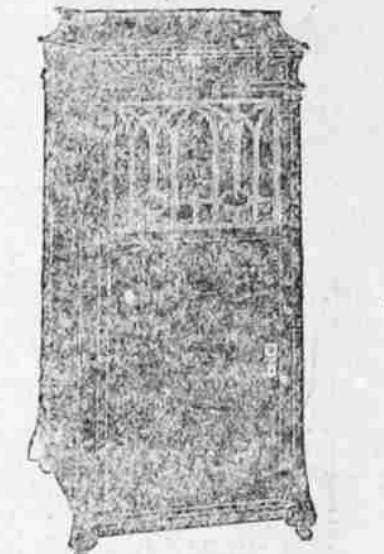
Methodist Men's club met for the monthly dinner and program in the church Tuesday evening. It was open night and women of the church were guests.

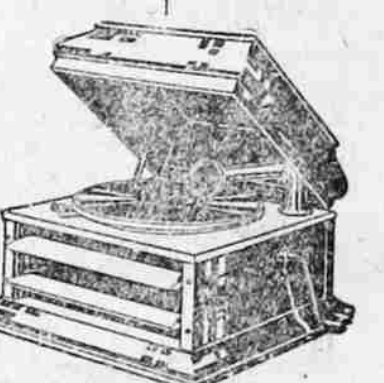

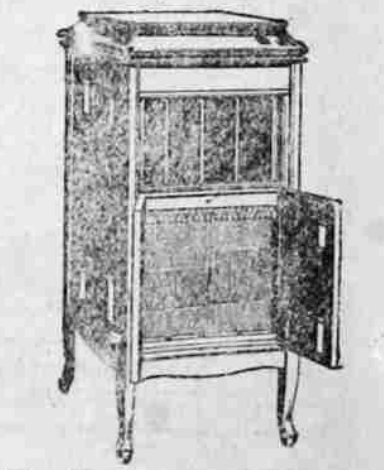
