

GOES TO PRISON FOR TAKING AUTO

Judge Agee Sentences Fred Wasley to Serve One to Ten Years

Indication that automobile thieves are to receive no leniency under the new law which makes the theft of a car a felony, came yesterday in the district court when Fred Wasley was sentenced to serve from one to ten years at hard labor in the state penitentiary. Wasley was arrested last Monday and charged with the theft of a car belonging to W. H. Draney of Ogden. Tomorrow he will be taken to the state prison to begin his term, marking the speediest disposal of a case of this kind since the law went into effect.

Wasley was arrested in Lewiston while alleged to have been repairing the stolen car. Logan officers appeared at a shed door where he was busily changing the color of the machine and took the man by surprise. He broke and ran, but the officers found him later hiding among some sagebrush.

Wasley is said to have admitted stealing the car here October 18, and pleaded guilty yesterday before Judge A. W. Agee. Weber county now holds the distinction of gaining two convictions under the new law and also the credit of having sent the first felon to the penitentiary who was tried since the law went into effect. District Attorney Stuart P. Dobbs acted as prosecutor in both cases.

GROWER INVITES HARD LUCK MEDAL ON HIS BEET CROP

Hundreds of Weber county farmers are reaping benefits of an exceptionally fine beet crop, but one individual, said to be a resident of Ogden valley, suffered "tough" luck, it is reported.

The grower planted a good sized field of beets last spring, at cost him on the average of \$12 per acre for his seed and labor. The beets did not attain any greater size than that of a healthy carrot.

Summer came and went and the farmer had to neglect his other crops to a certain extent to weed beets.

Fall came with accompanying rain. Labor was scarce and the grower had trouble in getting his beets from the ground. Finally he had them all dug and topped.

The roads were almost impassable and he could not get his beets hauled. Finally he made a deal with a neighbor tendering half of his beet crop in payment for the hauling of the beets.

After he had completed his deal in sugar beets he managed to break even on his beet crop by selling 200 bushels of wheat at \$1.10 per bushel.

The required number of men necessary to place the unit at full strength have been enrolled and work will be started by the new unit immediately following the holidays.

Announcements for the medical corps, which will be attached to the Ninth Army corps in the United States army with the Utah troops, will arrive here early in February and will be placed in immediate effect.

The organization as it now stands is composed of two commissioned officers and 48 enlisted men. Drills will be held every Tuesday and Thursday evening beginning shortly after the new year.
