

NEED HELP IN SEAL CAMPAIGN

Local Secretary Says Ogden Likely to Fall Down In Drive

Unless Ogdenites lend a hand in co-operating with those in charge of the Christmas seal campaign here, Ogden will fall short of obtaining the local portion of the amount to be raised by the state, according to local Secretary George D. Bennett. Thus far Ogden has contributed \$500. Ogden is far behind in the campaign and unless steps are taken to aid in the drive by local women and men, Ogden will fall in her attempt to raise her quota of \$5,000, he said.

The school children of the city have sold \$154 worth of seals.

The county schools are also doing good work in the present drive. A number of the schools of the city have signified their intention of purchasing \$5 bonds.

"Utah's quota is \$47,000," said Secretary Bennett. "Your aid is necessary in order to put both Utah and Ogden over the top. Through the efforts of Troop 18 of the Ogden Boy Scouts a booth was erected at the poultry show last night.

Four-minute women of Ogden will speak in the theatres of Ogden on the campaign tomorrow evening. They will be supervised by Mrs. J. G. Falk. Saturday evening the four-minute men under S. P. Dobbs will close their campaign.

Booths will be established in all of the stores and banks of the city next Saturday. Miss Gladys Rich will have charge of these workers.

From present indications the sale of the coming Saturday will far eclipse that of other Saturday's of the campaign. More than thirty young women will aid in the coming drive.

Editor Standard-Examiner:

In a recent issue of this paper there appeared an editorial from which the following extracts are taken:

"Housing conditions in Ogden City almost preclude a growth in population, families coming into the city are unable to find accommodations. What to do to solve this problem is a puzzle."

"Advocating the giving of federal aid, Senator Kenyon says you cannot expect to get good citizens unless their surroundings are healthful and conducive to comfort and sanitary arrangements, there is nothing that will produce bolshevism more rapidly than the housing of many people, especially those coming freshly to our shores, in crowded and sordid quarters."

"It is seriously estimated that there is a shortage of from two hundred to five hundred houses in this city to properly house the people already here, and to provide for the natural growth in population of a city so favorably located for an industrial center as is Ogden, there should be at least eight hundred houses built in the next two years. Why is this not being done? It is said that capital is timid, but why timid in this case? To receive very large returns on the investments instances can be cited where rents have increased 200 per cent in the past few years, and the working class who are the victims, this same class are now confronted by a proposition to naturally reduce their wages. Rentals have not declined and will not so long as this shortage exists. Hence, it is not hard to understand why certain of our wealthy citizens refuse to invest in housing. They will not so long as they can get a return for their money. It is up to you to remedy this situation."
