Steel Magnate Says People Want to Buy Freely at Reasonable Prices

NEW YORK, Dec. 38.—The present conomic depression in the United States is the result of "natural and necessary readjustments" and until States is the result of "actural and until these are completed," we may not expect all we might hope for," Eibert H. Gary, chairman of the board of directors of the United States Steel corporation, declared here Wednesday, While there are "many things in the general atmosphere which are disquieting," he said, he is as "hopeful and confident of the future," as he has been at any time.




