NAMING THE NEW CABINET.

On Tuesday the Associated Press carried a story from Marion, Ohio, to the effect that President-elect Harding is nearing a decision on the most important cabinet appointments, and a list of seven was given out which included Charles E. Hughes for secretary of state, and Charles G. Dawes of Illinois as secretary of the treasury.

At the last election, the voters of the state decided in favor of a constitutional amendment which would increase the revenue of the school districts of Utah.
