## WAR SWORD HANGING BY THREAD

### STOLEN CORPSE FOUND IN FIRE

### James Stillman Denied Divorce

#### GRAVE ROBBER USES BODY IN ARSON SCHEME

Cemetery Theft and Insurance Plot Connection Seen in Fire  
POLICE SEEK OWNER  
War Bride Insists Mate With \$16,000 Policy Died in Blaze

ST. LOUIS, Sept. 29.—(By the Associated Press.)—Police today announced they were convinced that Harry R. Brennan placed the body of Miss Celestine Schneider, 18, in his garage at Oakville, just south of here shortly before it was destroyed by fire early yesterday. Brennan, who carries \$16,000 life insurance, disappeared simultaneously with the starting of the fire and at first it was believed the body found in the ruins was his. An order for his arrest has been sent to all parts of the country.

STOLEN FROM GRAVE  
The body of Miss Schneider was stolen from its grave in Mount Hope cemetery, near Oakville, Monday night, and when found in the debris of the destroyed garage was burned so badly that virtually all exterior traces of identification had disappeared. It required an abdominal operation to ascertain the body was that of a woman, and particularly an abdominal incision made it possible to determine that it was that of Miss Schneider.

AUTO IS CLUE  
The body was resting in an automobile when found in the ruins and police say they learned today that the car was the same one that Brennan was seen riding in Monday night on the night on which the grave robbery occurred. This was determined by the license number and a name plate which were not destroyed by the fire.

GRUESOME MYSTERY  
ST. LOUIS, Sept. 29.—(By the Associated Press.)—Police authorities of St. Louis and St. Louis county today redoubled their efforts to find Harry Brennan, 22 years old, who has been missing since his garage at Oakville, Mo., was destroyed by fire last Tuesday morning, and who is sought in connection with the police terming one of the most gruesome mysteries in local police history.

DENIES CONSPIRACY  
Steadfastly maintaining that she believed her father, who was born, carried a total of \$16,000 life insurance, had died in the garage blaze, Mrs. Brennan, 22, a German war bride with an 11-month-old infant in her arms, denied, after county authorities discovered the body was that of a girl.

PLANNED GOING ABOARD  
The police asserted that further investigation revealed that Brennan and his wife were planning going to Germany to live as soon as they accumulated necessary funds.  
That Mrs. Brennan had told her sister-in-law she would return to Germany where she married Brennan while he was in the American army of occupation, as soon as the claims for Brennan's life insurance were settled.

#### AUTO BANDITS GET \$75,000 PAYROLL FROM CITY

VANCOUVER, B. C., Sept. 29.—City Paymaster T. A. Schooley was held up and robbed of \$75,000 by two automobile bandits today. The robbers escaped, making a sensational dash through the business district. Schooley had just left the city hall when the men assaulted him and snatched a bag containing the money.

#### SLAYER GOES TO SCAFFOLD CURSING ALL

ARIZONA MURDERER ATTEMPTS TO ESCAPE NOOSE BY FEIGNING INSANITY  
FLORENCE, Ariz., Sept. 29.—The odorous West, maintaining to the last his sham of insanity, died on the gallows of the Arizona state prison here at 5 o'clock this morning. He was executed for the murder of Lem Smith, in Mohave county in July, 1921.

BODY DISCOVERED  
The body of Smith with a bullet hole in the back of the head was found beside the road between Otman and Topop, in Mohave county in July, 1921.

SLAYER SCORED  
In denying West's appeal, the state supreme court declared:  
"No more positive, clear, plain and convincing association of facts and circumstances ever eventuated to point out unerringly and absolutely the source of a crime than those developed in this case. The number of such cases occurring in Arizona is alarming and the circumstances of their commission exhibit extreme depravity."

GIRLS MUST WEAR UNIFORM DRESSES  
KLAMATH FALLS, Ore., Sept. 29.—Girl students at the Klamath county high school here after this must wear the uniform dress adopted by the student body last year or present a satisfactory excuse for noncompliance. This was the ruling of Robert Goetz, principal. The uniform consists of low heeled black shoes, black stockings, a dark blue or black skirt and a white middie blouse.

#### Baby Guy Declared Legitimate; Decree Victory For Woman

Wife Absolved of Intimacy With Indian by Referee Who Heard Evidence in Most Sensational Domestic Rupture Recorded in High Society

CARMEL, N. Y., Sept. 29.—(By the Associated Press.)—James A. Stillman, former president of the National City bank of New York was denied a decree in his suit for absolute divorce against his wife, Anne U. Stillman, and baby Guy Stillman was declared legitimate in the findings of Daniel J. Gleason, referee in the case which was filed here.

HOW TO OPEN VAULTS TOLD IN PAMPHLET  
LOS ANGELES, Sept. 29.—A pamphlet giving minute instructions in "safe cracking" found in the possession of a man who gave his name as Charles Brown and believed by the police to be "Gentleman Charlie," well known to the police of the east, led the officers here to express the belief a school for beginners in robbery of safes and vaults existed in or near Chicago.

FURS SAID TO BE WORTH \$11,000 FOUND WITH SUSPECT  
BROWN DECLINED TO EXPLAIN HOW THE PAMPHLET CAME INTO HIS POSSESSION OR TO STATE WHETHER HE HAD FOLLOWED THE INSTRUCTIONS IT CONTAINED FOR OPENING 19 MAKES OF SAFES AND FIVE MAKES OF VAULTS WITHOUT REFERRING TO THE USE OF EXPLOSIVES.

DYNAMITE FOUND ABOARD LOCOMOTIVE  
SAN BERNARDINO, Cal., Sept. 29.—Workmen today found 16 sticks of dynamite in the tool box of a locomotive in the Atchinson, Topeka & Santa Fe roundhouse here. Attached to the dynamite was a capsule filled with acid. This acid ate through the capsule in an hour and a half after the dynamite was discovered, and apparently had been designed to set off the blast, which officers say would have wrecked the round house and damaged many locomotives.

CARS NOT AVAILABLE; STEEL MILLS CLOSE  
YOUNGSTOWN, Ohio, Sept. 29.—The first curtailment of steel operations on account of car shortage was announced here today by the Republic Iron and Steel company which has shut down eight of its 16 sheet mills at the plant in Niles.

JAPANESE LEAVE SIBERIAN MAINLAND  
TOKIO, Sept. 29.—(By the Associated Press.)—Japanese evacuation of the Siberian mainland has been completed and civil administration of that territory has been withdrawn. It was announced official here today.

LARGE FIRE LOSS IN ALABAMA TOWN  
GEORGINA, Ala., Sept. 29.—Four business blocks were destroyed in an early morning fire here, causing an estimated loss of \$200,000. Seventeen buildings were burned and five residences destroyed.

George on Throne With Cabinet of Twelve Governing Country

VENIZELOS CONFERS  
One General Declares That Greeks Will Insist on Having Republic

PARIS, Sept. 29.—(By the Associated Press.)—Former Premier Venizelos received the following telegram today:  
"The revolutionary committee expresses its entire confidence in you in charging you with the defense of the national cause and solicits your immediate co-operation."

MINISTERS ARRESTED  
Five ministers of the Protapakis government have been imprisoned, the message states, charged with responsibility for the defeat of the Greek army in Asia Minor and succeeding events in Greece. These ministers, it is declared, will be tried by a military commission. They are M. Gounaris, Stratos, Theotokis, Goudas and Protapakis.

GEORGE NOW KING  
ATHENS, Sept. 29.—(By the Associated Press.)—Crown Prince George has taken the oath as king, and Greece, pending the formation of a new ministry, is being governed by a provisional government.

It is probable that a military cabinet will be formed, but the revolutionary committee will continue its surveillance of the new regime. Athens continues quiet, perfect order being maintained everywhere.

VENIZELOS CONFERS  
PARIS, Sept. 29.—(By the Associated Press.)—Former Premier Venizelos returned to Paris from Deauville today and immediately entered into conference with friends and political associates who gathered at his hotel.

TURK-BULGARIAN 'ALLIANCE' DENIED  
WASHINGTON, Sept. 29.—Reports of an "alliance" between Bulgaria and Turkey were denied in a statement issued today by the Bulgarian legation here.

### BRITISH STEADILY INCREASING PREPARATIONS FOR WAR; CABINET SEEKS WAY OUT OF DIFFICULTIES

Knowledge That Soviet Russia Is Closely Connected With Kemal Government Adds to Fears in Official Quarters; Believe Turks Will Try to Provoke Tommies to Shoot First

LONDON, Sept. 29.—(By the Associated Press.)—The British government has sent a virtual ultimatum to Mustapha Kemal Pasha stating that his troops must leave the Chanak zone.

CONSTANTINOPLE, Sept. 29.—(By the Associated Press.)—Mustapha Kemal Pasha replying to General Harington's telegram of Wednesday has sent a message declaring his troops would not advance further. He says he desires that no incident should occur and that he will see General Harington as soon as possible.

NEW YORK, Sept. 29.—Reports that the British troops in the neutral zone around the Dardanelles had been hemmed in by the Kemal forces resulted today in a sharp break in sterling exchange in London, which immediately was reflected here. Demand bills here were quoted at \$4.37 or 2 cents below Thursday night's closing quotation.

CLIMAX FAST APPROACHING IN NEAR EAST  
LONDON, Sept. 29.—(By the Associated Press.)—Grave fears for a recurrence of general warfare in Europe as a result of the Near East crisis are occupying the minds of British official circles, it is stated in authoritative quarters.

General Harington Leaves For Conference With Kemal at Mudania  
CONSTANTINOPLE, Sept. 29.—(By the Associated Press.)—Brigadier General Sir Charles Harington, commander in chief of the British forces in the Dardanelles area, plans to leave this afternoon for a conference with Mustapha Kemal Pasha, probably at Mudania, on the sea of Marmora.

CLIMAX APPROACHING  
According to the Exchange Telegraph, part of the French troops which were withdrawn from Chatalja, and which have since been in Constantinople, will be used for the defense of the European shore of the Bosphorus.

UNDER WHITE FLAG  
"Cavalry detachments in bands of 100 or 200 continue to filter in," says the Morning Post's Constantinople correspondent. "They carry white flags or with rifles reversed whenever they are near our troops. They show no aggression but make the British situation militarily most difficult, and their movements naturally furnish an excellent method of reconnoitering."

VESSELS POWERFUL  
The British are confident that they can hold their lines against any Kemal attack. Among the British naval units are the superdreadnoughts Revenge and Resolute, the most powerful men of war afloat.
