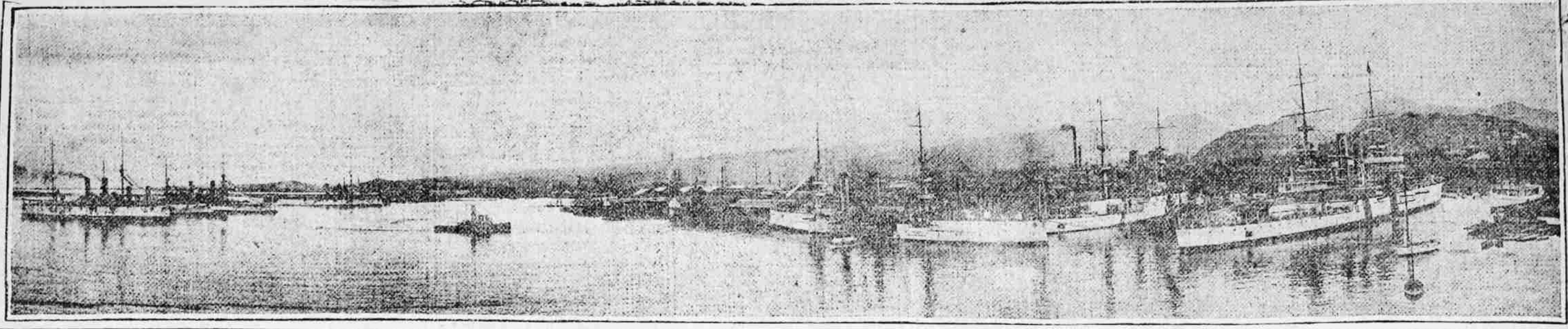

Judge Zane Gives Personal Reminiscences of His Friend, the Martyred President.

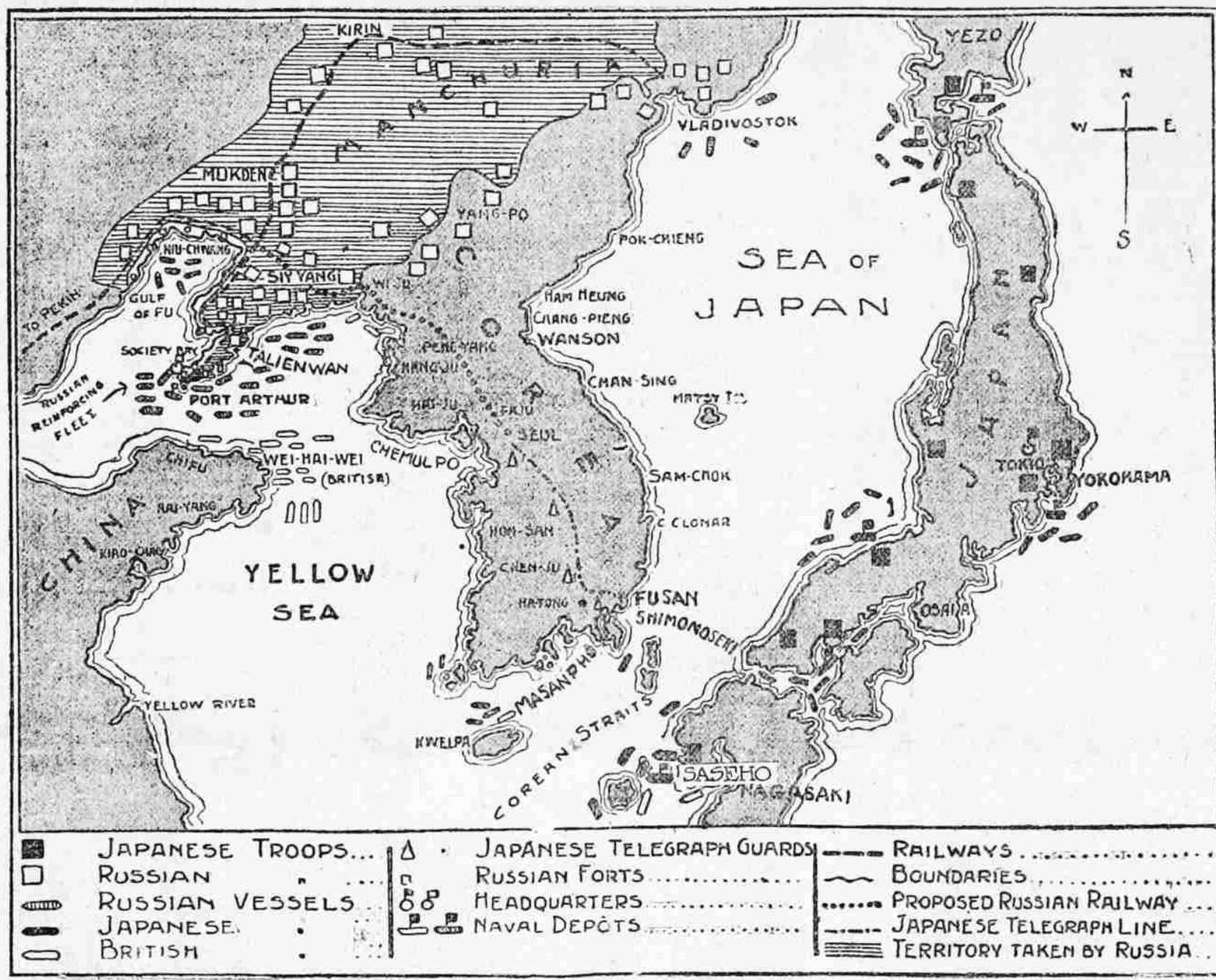
