

MAJ. L'ENFANT IS EULOGIZED

Memorial to French Engineer Who Planned Washington Unveiled at Arlington.

PRESIDENT SPEAKS IN PATRIOTIC PRAISE

Embassador Jusserand Delivers the Principal Address in Honor of Countryman.

WASHINGTON, May 22.—On the green knoll in front of the old Lee mansion in Arlington cemetery a memorial was unveiled to Major Pierre Charles L'Enfant, the French engineer, to whose prophetic vision Washington owes its broad avenues and its symmetry of design.

President Taft, Embassador Jusserand of France and Senator Root of New York spoke in eulogy of Major L'Enfant.

L'Enfant will now lie here appropriately in state and in rest, with the gratitude of the nation that he served so well.

Had Soul of a Prophet. "With the mind of a poet, with the soul of a prophet, a man foresaw, over a century ago, what we now see; and that man lies under the monument which a generous congress allows us to dedicate today—Major Pierre Charles L'Enfant."

Foresew the Future. Referring to the derisive wonder with which Washington as "a town of streets without houses and houses without streets," was viewed by many in the early days, but for those of ours, and when the time shall come that people will wonder at the rapid expansion of this country, when the hundred million inhabitants of today will look like a petty number, still L'Enfant's plan will hold good, and for our successors as for us, he might be able to say: "For you it was that I worked."

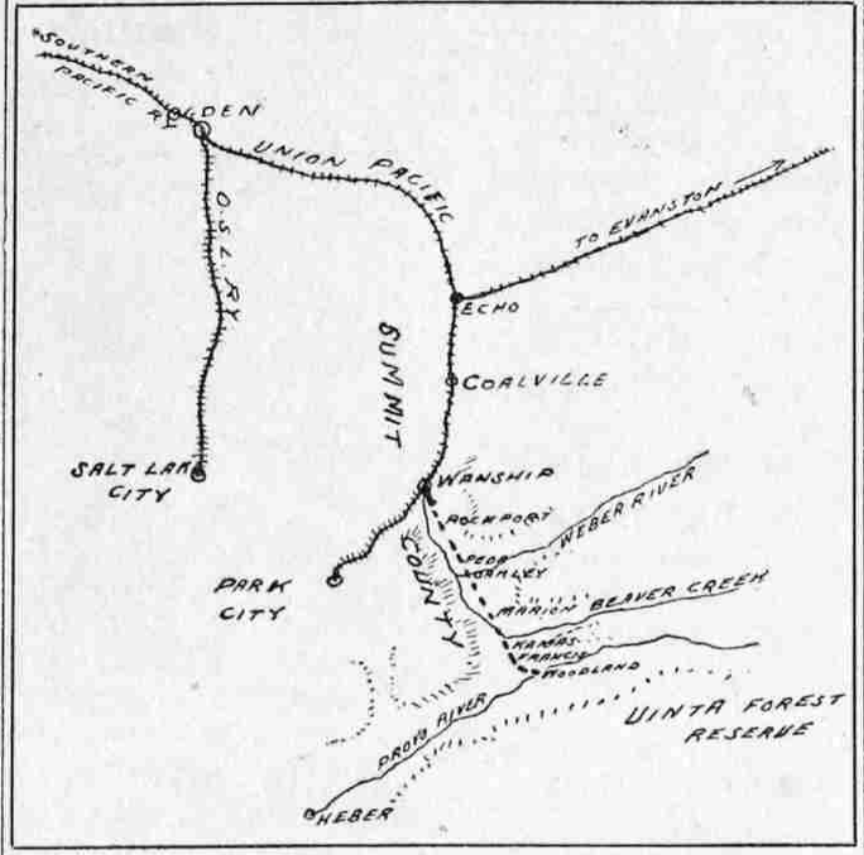

Rhodes Valley Farmers Eager for a Railroad

Line When Completed Will Open an Immense Area to the Markets of the World

SPECIAL TO THE TRIBUNE. KAMAS, May 22.—Practically every farmer and business man in Rhodes valley, generally known as Kamas prairie, from Wanship on the north to Woodland on the south, is exerting himself in the best movement for a railroad, which, when completed, will open the way to the world's markets for the vast resources of approximately 25,000 acres of the state's most fertile land.

A mass meeting was held at Kamas Saturday night, at which the general opinion of the assemblage was voiced when one speaker declared that a railroad was wanted by the people of Rhodes valley, that it was an absolute necessity, and that the only possible way to get a railroad was for the people themselves to build it.

William Barnes, cashier of the State Bank of Kamas, who is the prime mover in agitating the question of a railroad, was made chairman of the committee. The other members of the committee are President Hoyt of the State Bank of Kamas; Judge Stewart of Salt Lake City; Bishop Corbett and Bishop Pack of Kamas prairie; Mr. Walter, general manager of the Consolidated Implement company of Kamas; Mayor McCormick of Kamas and A. W. Williams, who is extensively engaged in the lumber business in Rhodes valley.

HARRY JOSEPH CHIEF ENGINEER. Harry Joseph of Salt Lake City, who was called to attend the meeting, was immediately engaged as chief engineer by Mr. Barnes, with instructions to make preliminary surveys and map out a route for the proposed road.

"It is practically certain that the road will be built," said Mr. Joseph just prior to his departure for Salt Lake. "Every man and woman along the contemplated route is bubbling over with enthusiasm about it. The road will connect with the Union Pacific at Wanship, and will extend to Woodland, a distance of about seventeen miles, in the southern end of the valley. It will pass through Rockport, Peoa, Oakley, Marion, Kamas and Francis.

A comparatively small outlay of capital, considering the usual cost of railroad building, should be required to construct the road. The principal cost will be the steel. The timber can be cut right on the ground, and there will be no deep cuts or fills along the entire route. Wanship has an altitude of 5800 feet, Woodland 6800 feet, making an average grade of 50 feet to the mile, with very little curvature.

At Work in Earnest. "Sub-committees have been appointed; one to procure rights of way and to raise \$50,000 among the farmers and

stockmen. Practically this sum has already been subscribed. Another committee was appointed to call a boost meeting on Friday, May 26, at Peoa of the citizens of Peoa, Marion, Oakley and Rockport. Saturday night a meeting will be held at Woodland, which will be attended by the citizens of Woodland and Francis.

As planned to date, the new company will be capitalized for \$250,000, shares at the par value of \$1; 125,000 shares will be preferred stock, 7 per cent. The road should earn, almost from the beginning, 12 per cent on the estimated cost of construction, \$125,000, which will leave a substantial dividend on the common stock, of which there will be 125,000 shares. Without some serious hitch in construction the road should be ready to operate within one year from the time the first spike is driven.

Is Fertile Valley. Rhodes valley is seventeen miles long, with an average width of a trifle more than two miles, or an area of thirty-five square miles, every foot of which is under cultivation or timber. The entire valley is abundantly watered. Beaver creek, Provo and Weber rivers, and numerous tributaries provide enough water to irrigate a tract of land many times the area of Kamas prairie. Fishing here is said to be excellent in no other portion of the state.

Give Attention to Horses. Many of the farmers specialize in the raising of thoroughbred stallions, with the result that some of the finest draft horses in the country are sired in the valley. Building stone of fine quality is found in immense quantities in the surrounding mountains.

MINERS BEGAIN WORK UP NORTH

Decline to Await Outcome of the Litigation Over Alaska Coal Claims.

EXPEDITION LEAVES CORDOVA LAUNCHES

Citizens of Seattle Protest in Mass Meeting Against Any Further Delay.

CORDOVA, Alaska, May 22.—Unwilling to sit idly by awaiting the action of the government in opening the Alaska coal lands, nearly 100 citizens of Cordova left today for the Bering river coal fields near Katalla, twenty-five miles east of here, where they intend to begin mining for the markets of this city and other Alaska towns.

SEATTLE, Wash., May 22.—A resolution protesting against the delay in the adjudication of the Alaska coal claims and calling attention to the fact that the executive order withdrawing the Alaska coal lands from entry was adopted tonight at a mass meeting of citizens called to consider the coal situation in the northern territory.

CLAUSE DECLARED INVALID BY COURT. Article in Oklahoma Constitution Suppressing Negro Vote Violation of the Fifteenth Amendment.

OKLAHOMA CITY, May 22.—Holding the fifteenth amendment to the constitution invalid because it is in violation of the federal constitution, Judge J. S. Cotterill in his opinion today overruled the decision of the supreme court in the case of the United States vs. J. J. Beal and Frank Gunn, D. W. Jeffries and Willard Smith, election officers.

ACTIONS STARTED BY COMMISSIONER. Effort Being Made to Enforce Law Regarding Employment of Children in Montana.

HELENA, Mont., May 22.—Ten actions were started today by State Labor Commissioner J. H. Hall for alleged violations of the law prohibiting the employment of children under 16 years of age in the case of the Western Union Postal Telegraph company, whose messengers, it is said, were below the legal age limit, and the owners of the business blocks in which the elevator boys were alleged to be under 16.
