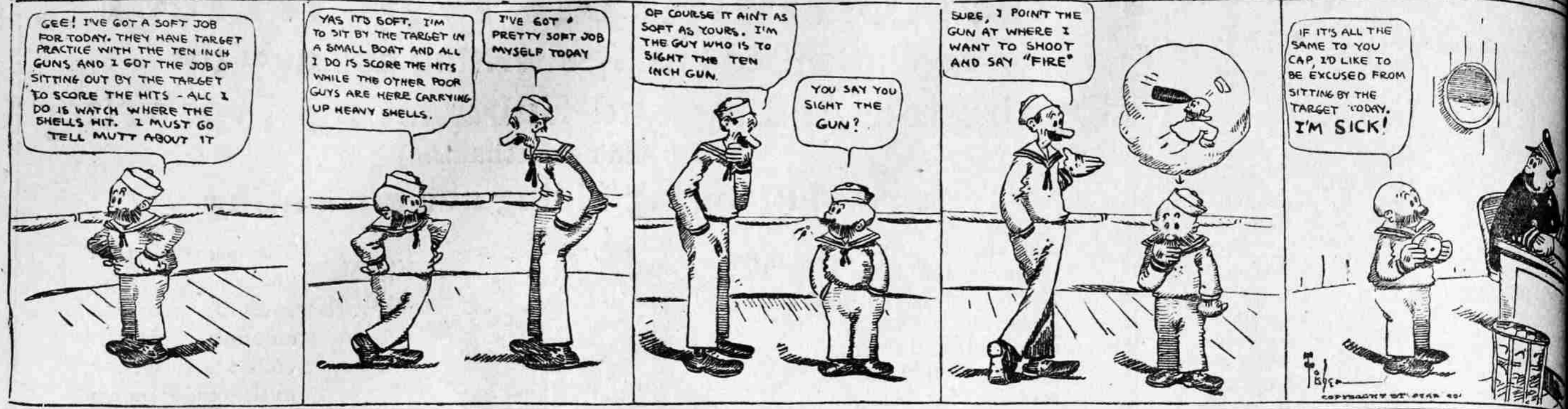


Jeff Delights in Spoiling Mutt's Pleasure
