AD, Colo., June 19.—Twelve men were entombed and are believed to be dead as a result of an explosion in the Hastings mine of the Victor American Fuel company last night.

Rescue equipment is being sent to the scene of the disaster. The mine is located sixteen miles west of Trinidad. The explosion was caused by a quantity of dynamite which set off a quantity of gas in the mine, where development is in progress. The fourteen men were on the night shift and were in the mine when the explosion occurred.

Rescue work is being carried on by the Colorado Fuel and Iron company. The rescue crews of other companies are also on the ground.

Believed Lost.

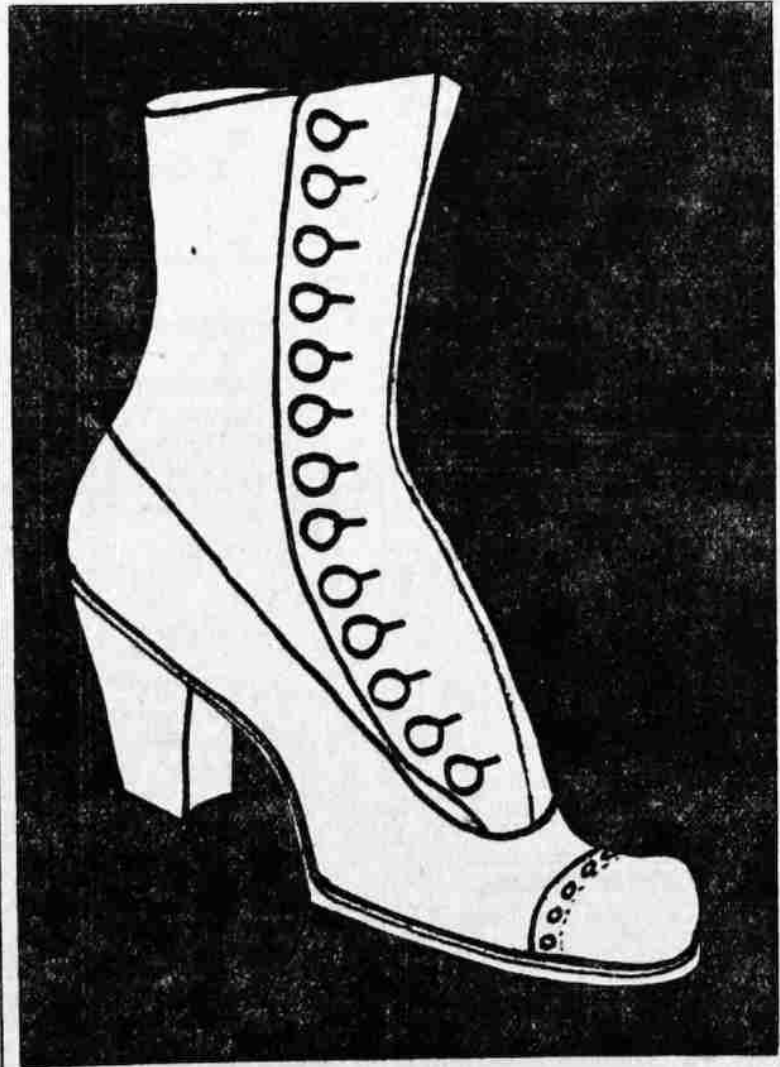
