MEAKIN RECEIVES DANGEROUS SHOT Promoter Tells Confused Story of Wound at Boarding House.

Captain George Frederick Meakin, thirty-four years old, who claims to have been an aide on Lord Kitchener's staff and to have fought through the Boer War, was dangerously shot at 11:20 o'clock yesterday afternoon in the home of A. J. Lawler, 106 1-2 East Clay Street.

Police Notified. It was Mrs. Lawler who called the city ambulance, and Dr. Tartar and Chauffeur Drake immediately notified the police when they were unable to locate the ambulance.

Had Seen Hollywood Grave. Mrs. Lawler explained that he had once accompanied her to the grave of her father, buried in Hollywood, who was a year ago shot and killed himself in Washington.
