## WARWICK CASE COMES UP FIRST

### State Board of Fisheries Will Begin It's Work Early Says Mr. Mathews.

## MATHEWS COUNTY HAS A "SCRAP"

### Members of the Board Have Arrived in Hampton and Are Now Ready For the Fray—May Elect Captains and Engineers for the Oyster Navy—Headquarters Opened.

Unless there is a change in the program, the first matter to be taken up by the State Board of Fisheries this morning will be the contested fight over the oyster inspector for Warwick county.

Hon. McDonald Lee, chairman; Hon. S. Wilkins Mathews, secretary; Hon. George B. Keezel, State senator from Orlinham; Hon. Bland M. M. of Richmond, members of the board, reached Hampton last evening and the board expects to get down to work at 9 o'clock this morning. Nicely furnished rooms have been provided for the board in the Masonic Temple.

**Much Business Before Board.**  
Mr. Mathews said last night that the board will likely be in session two or three days and that it is the intention of the members to consider the Warwick case first and then take up the election of the other inspectors. Mr. Mathews said also that the board may enter into the election of captains for the oyster navy, and for the engineers of the various boats. There is no telling just how many candidates will be for the positions of captains, mates and engineers. It may be that the board will defer the election of these officials until the meeting in July.

**Many Persons Here From Mathews.**  
Another spirited contest will be that from district 17a, of Mathews county. Many men from that county reached here last night charged with ammunition for the battle. Among those already on the ground from Mathews are Hon. G. E. T. Lane, member of the House of Delegates; Hon. G. Y. Hundley, former member of the house; Mr. J. J. Burke, treasurer of the county; Mr. J. W. Minter, the present oyster inspector and Mr. W. G. Miles, who hopes to scalp Mr. Minter on this occasion. Mr. W. P. Davis is another politician from Mathews. This will be a stubbornly fought contest. Mr. Minter is a Confederate veteran and Mr. Miles is a young man whom the Minter supporters declare has not a vote in Mathews county.

**Permanent Headquarters.**  
There is little doubt of the board selecting Hampton for permanent headquarters. Most of the members favor Hampton and as the business men of the town have offered free rooms it is expected that the board will decide to hold all of its meetings in this town.

Hon. S. Gordon Cunningham has been untiring in his efforts to secure the headquarters for Hampton and to his work alone will be due the credit.

### Prof. Hutcherson to Use the Horizontal Bars in the Parachute Drop on That Occasion.

Professor Edward R. Hutcherson, the aeronaut, made the prettiest ascension of the week at Buckroe Beach last night. Ascending to a height of 2,000 feet, the aeronaut cut himself loose in the parachute and dropped within 300 yards of the spot from which he started.

Professor Hutcherson will make an ascension each evening during the week.

Saturday afternoon at 4 o'clock the aeronaut will give a matinee ascension. It is his purpose at that time to make the parachute drop on the horizontal bars.

## POLICY OF THE LACKAWANNA.

Management is Encouraging Traffic to Make Road Less Dependent. (Special to the Daily Press.) NEW YORK, May 15.—While the Lackawanna road is generally understood to own about 400,000,000 tons of unmined anthracite coal, it is admitted that the management is making great efforts to encourage the growth of general traffic.

This attitude is one to the steady growth in the system's coal business, which last year amounted to 6,792,360 tons. Should the coal business continue to grow, as it undoubtedly will, the great reserve supply will perceptibly decrease in the course of years, so the future of the road undeniably demands a policy enabling it to become less dependent on this class of business.

Efforts in this direction made by the present management for the last few years have been productive of considerable success. From 1889 to 1906 the annual tonnage of the road in agricultural products has increased 60,577 tons, while animal products show a gain of 322,17 tons.

## QUEEN IN AUTOMOBILE CRASH.

Mother of the Sovereign of the Netherlands is Thrown Out. (By Associated Press.)

BERLIN, GERMANY, May 15.—The Dowager Queen Emma, of the Netherlands, mother of Queen Wilhelmina, was thrown from an automobile at Steinfurt, Westphalia, where she was attending the silver wedding of Prince and Princess von Bentheim-Steinfurt. The machine struck a butcher's wagon ejecting Her Majesty and Prince von Bentheim-Steinfurt. The Queen mother was bruised, but remained her ride.
