

STOCKS AND BONDS

Market Develops Strength and Shows Some Expansion.

PENNSYLVANIA ONE OF LEADERS

Extraordinary Prosperity in Coppers is Reflected by Demand for These Securities—Ore Deal Group Sluggish—Money Continues Easy.

(By Associated Press.) NEW YORK, N. Y., Oct. 10.—Dealings in stock expanded in some degree, today, and strength in the market was better distributed and, consequently, had more sympathetic effect on the general list. The result was to diminish the spotty appearance of the market.

The ore deal group was sluggish until late in the day, when a demand for United States Steel developed, which carried it to the highest price on the present movement.

The extraordinary prosperity in the copper trade was moderately reflected in the movement in Amalgamated Copper. Hopes of dividend increases were motives for the rise in Pennsylvania and American Smelting, although the latter stock showed the effect of profit taking in its wide advance during the course of the day.

Money continued to work easier, in spite of the manifest pressure for remittance to London, which made sterling exchange strong not only here, but in Paris and Berlin.
