(Special to the Daily Press). RICHMOND, VA., July 6.—A special from Franklin county tonight says that the murder on yesterday of Marshall King by Edward Saul was caused by jealousy over the affections of Miss Bessie Ramsey, of that county, with whom both men were in love.

Saul passed the Ramsey home while hunting and saw King in the parlor with Miss Ramsey. He concealed his gun and approached the house and asked King to come out as he wanted to have a talk with him. King was overheard begging Saul not to shoot him. King fell at the first shot with a bullet in his heart.

Saul threw the gun from him, crying out "Good bye, folks, I am gone" and fled. He was seen going in the direction of Martinsville. The young men were of one age and had been raised together. King was quiet and industrious. Saul was known as a rowdy character.

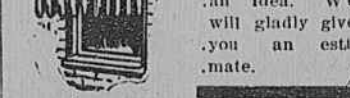
