Maryland Leaves Dock.

The New York, Philadelphia and Norfolk railway passenger steamer Maryland was floated out of dry dock No. 2 at the shipyard, yesterday after having her hull below the waterline cleaned and painted.

The British steamer Crown of Aragon sailed yesterday for the Bremerton navy yard, Pudget Sound, Washington, with a cargo of 4,821 tons of coal valued at \$14,010.

West Virginia Ranks Second.

The most important change in the order of the coal-producing States resulting from conditions which existed in 1906 was the replacement of Illinois by West Virginia as the second State in rank.

The only other changes in rank among the ten leading States was the resumption of fifth place by Alabama, which had been supplanted in 1905 by Indiana (now sixth), and the supplanting of Kansas by Tennessee as the tenth State in amount of production.

The record for 1906 shows that Pennsylvania's output has once more fallen below 50 per cent. of the total production of the United States.

NEW LOCAL ENTERPRISE MANY REFORMS IN COREA

Organization of Ice Coal and Wood Company Planned. People of Isolated Nation Cutting Their Hair and Dressing Like Westerners.

Reform stalks abroad throughout Corea, says the Seoul correspondent of the New York Herald. The bulwarks of conservatism are being savagely attacked, and one by one they fall.

It is proposed to organize the company with an authorized capital of \$1,000,000, divided into 1,000,000 shares of a par value of \$1 each, the stock to be issued full payable and nonassessable. Fifty thousand shares will be set aside for organization purposes and 950,000 shares will be placed in the treasury of the company as surplus for carrying on the business.

The parties applying for the charter who will likely be named in the charter as officers and directors to act the first year are as follows: President, C. C. Smith, of the firm of C. C. Smith and Company; treasurer, W. H. Kellogg, cashier of the Newport News National Bank; secretary, J. W. Kellam, manager of the City Coal and Wood Company, and Joseph Mortimer, a machinist at the shipyard.
