Naturally it all happened because the Reds won another from the Brooklyn patriots, though the game was pitched so close that putting Jim Jeffries' most mighty wrath back into the class with an infant's harness act, Cook lammed one across after the last man had been called out in the ninth, and everybody was homeward bound with thoughts of the evening meal up-ermost, and a pleasant retrospect that Richmond was 5 to 4 on the right side of the scoreboard, which very nearly put Cullen down for the count.
