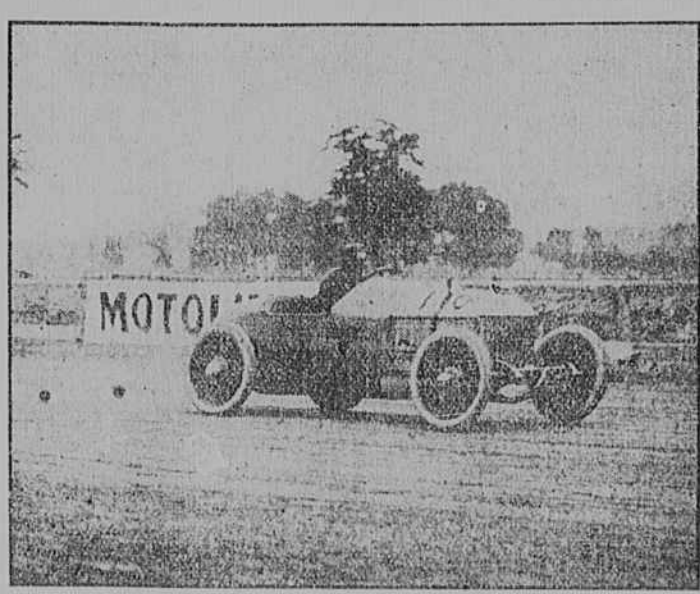

54 CLASSES TO BE SHOWN AT ORANGE

Prize List of Fifteenth Annual Exhibition, July 24 and 25, Is Issued.

(Special to The Times-Dispatch.) Charlottesville, Va., July 1.—The prize list of the fifteenth annual exhibition of the Orange Horseman's Association, to be held Wednesday and Thursday, July 24 and 25, has made its appearance.

Entrants must be in the hands of the secretary, J. S. Tucker, on or before Friday, July 12. Fifty-four classes will be shown this year, including thoroughbred stallions, standard bred hackney, German and French coach and heavy draft stallions, six colt classes, brood mares, roadsters, farmers' general utility horses, harness (five classes), harness and saddle horses, combination harness and saddle horses, rounabout horse, tandem, folk hand, ponies in harness, ponies under saddle, park and field (three classes), green park saddle, salted saddle, green hunters, Orange county hunters, free-for-all handicaps, Tomahawks and light hunters, hunters, middle and heavyweight hunters, hunt club teams, ladies hunters, horse suitable to come a hunter, Corthlian class, hunting class, hunter class with hounds, male race and horn blowing.

Four cups have been hung up as follows: In the green hunter saddle class, by William Du Pont, president of the association, the cup to be retained by the Orange Horseman's Association until it has been won twice by the same owner. In the names and dates of all winners to be engraved on the cup. George T. Marshall will present a cup to the winner in the Green Hunter class, conformation and quality to count 40 per cent; performance over 60 per cent; not to exceed 4 feet 6 inches in height. The best lady hunter offers a cup for the best lady hunter, to be ridden by a lady over regulation jumps not to exceed four feet in performance and manners to count 75 per cent; winner in this class also gets cash prize of \$25. Mr. Du Pont also offers a silver cup in the horn blowers' class, and gives cash prizes for second, third and fourth winners.

The biggest cash prize, \$50, is for the best horse suitable to become a hunter; to be shown at a walk, trot and gallop, for best mare or gelding, three years old or over, bred in Orange county, and owned by a resident of Orange county; to be judged on conformation and movement only.
