

New York Stock Market

New York, July 23.—Further reaction was observed in the movement of stocks to-day. Prices showed an irregular trend at the outset, but actual business was not materialized until quite late in the session, when many of the leaders were materially higher than the preceding day's close.

The foremost factor to-day was the feeling of pessimism caused by published forecasts of the stannic committee report on the United States Steel Corporation. Some of the reported recommendations of the committee are more complex than were expected as a result of which Wall Street looks for a continuance of the agitation against the "steel" trust.

Steel was again the most active of the speculative issues and the speculative market of the week, although it closed lower than some other stocks in the same group. Despite a rather heavy and active trading was persistent but the shorts seemed to lack courage to carry their advantage very far. About the only stocks to dis-

play strength were those of the electrical companies. General Electric, advancing to its best price in some years on fundamental reports of an appropriation extra stock dividend.

Money on time worked toward greater ease, but money in the shorter interests was unchanged. The interest rate on the bill market was 6 1/2 per cent. United States government bonds were unchanged. Total sales, 19,109 shares of stocks.
