FOUR DISTRICTS HAVE PRIMARIES

Contests in Virginia This Year Signaled by Dignified Discussion.
SERIES BEGINS THIS WEEK
Incumbents in First, Third, Fourth and Sixth Districts Have Opposition.
Four Virginia districts will hold primaries this year to decide between Democratic candidates for Congress. These are the First, Third, Fourth and Sixth. In every instance the incumbent is seeking re-nomination, and has opposition.
For the most part, the congressional campaigns of this year are without spectacular features. Attacks on the records of the congressmen have been practically unknown. Little bitter feeling has been developed. Discussions have been confined mostly to issues and not to personalities. In this respect the fights have been much more dignified than others which have been had in recent years.

MANY GOOD JOBS GOING ON MARKET

But Those Who'll Lose 'Em After March 4 Won't Starve to Death.
FARMERS CALLING FOR HELP
Democratic Applicants Already Selecting Quarters in New Federal Building.
At all the Democrats in Richmond who hope and expect to hold office in the event of Woodrow Wilson's election would only come across with contributions to the campaign fund, the amount being sent to national headquarters will be very largely increased. Already the applicants are beginning to pick out their jobs. They have been taking a keen interest in the final work on the new post-office building which will be occupied next month. At the time the building was planned there did not seem to be much chance for the election of a Democratic or a Bull Moose President. Now the hope is that Wilson will run first with the Bull Moose, and the old line party fighting for second place.

CANDIDATE MAY WIN WITH 3,500

Politicians Think That Many Votes Will Elect to Administrative Board.
LOWEST MAY NOT GET 500
General Idea, However, Is That City Will Poll Its Maximum Vote.
With seventeen candidates in the field for the five seats on the Administrative Board, and with the vote well scattered along the line, it seems more than probable that several of the winners will have less than a majority of the total vote cast. As to the total vote there are varying estimates. Counting in Confederate soldiers, ex-convicts from payment of poll taxes, those who are about 12,200 qualified voters on the books, the number including colored voters, Republicans and men of no party affiliation. While it is certain that the Administrative Board primary on September 18 will bring out an almost vote cast in years, it does not seem probable that the total will exceed 8,000.

COUNCIL TO HOLD FINAL MEETING

Lower Branch Will Give Way to Smaller Body on September 1.
