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NEW METHOD OF REFORM Psychological Study Will Be Made of Indiana Convicts. Jeffersonville, Ind., August 13.—Psychological study of State convicts, aimed to cure mental deficiencies that led them into ways of crime, will be attempted in the Indiana Reformatory, according to an announcement made here by Superintendent Davis C. Peyton. A laboratory will be established in the reformatory, where tests of each prisoner's mentality may be made, after which cures will be attempted, according to the patient's needs. Superintendent Peyton declares this is a departure in reformatory work. He will have the assistance of R. B. Von Klein-smid, who has for several years held the chair of education and psychology in Depauw University. The propaganda is announced, has the approval of Governor Marshall. Several well-known psychologists, it is announced, will act as counsel in the work.
