COUNCIL ELECTS MAYOR TO-NIGHT

Richardson's Resignation Will Be Formally Received and Accepted.

A call was issued last night by President William H. Adams, of the Board of Aldermen, for a joint session of the Common Council and Board of Aldermen to be held to-night at 8 o'clock, to receive and act upon the resignation of Mayor B. C. Richardson, and to elect his successor. A clerk who accompanied the Mayor to the City Auditor will also be elected.

Mayor Richardson yesterday placed in the hands of City Clerk Ben T. August his formal resignation as follows:

September 2, 1912. To the Honorable Council of the City of Richmond: Gentlemen—I respectfully tender this, my resignation of the office of Mayor of the city of Richmond.

HOBSON'S RECORD IN CITY'S SERVICE

Dr. Ennion Williams Surprised He Is Not on Citizens' Ticket.

CLEANED UP THE CITY HOME Broke Up Graft and Mismanagement—Citizens' Committee Ignorant of Record.

In an open letter yesterday to the Citizens' Association, which has introduced a ticket for election to the Administrative Board, State Health Commissioner Ennion A. Williams indicates that he will go outside that ticket for at least one man.

Not knowing the scope of the investigation which the Citizens' Association says it conducted into the records of the candidates, Dr. Williams feels sure it did not extend to the records of the City Council. Had it done so, he believes, the association would never have made the mistake of leaving Mr. Hobson's name off the list, considering his record of actual services to the city of Richmond.

It is recalled that Dr. Williams had a part in the cleaning up of the City Home, and possesses first hand information on the subject. His letter is as follows:

Dr. Williams' Letter. Richmond, September 2, 1912. To the Citizens' Association: Gentlemen—Your letter requesting me to support the nominees of your party for the Administrative Board is duly received.

I am fully in accord with you in considering that the matter of selecting five administrators is one of the greatest importance, and that each voter should be satisfied that his selection was made intelligently.

You have undertaken to make this selection for those who cannot, or will not, make it for themselves.

I do not know what was the scope of your investigation of the records of the seventeen candidates, but I am entitled that it could not have extended to the Council records, or you would not have made the mistake of leaving off of your list a man who has demonstrated by actual services to the city that he possesses those qualities that should be most desired in members of the board.

Mr. Hobson, who was Chairman of the Board of Health, has done much for the city, and his record is well known. He has been instrumental in bringing about an investigation of the City Home, and in making the charges, notwithstanding the threats and the opposition of those concerned that his charges were being tampered with.

Among the findings of the investigation conducted by the Citizens' Association was the wide open drug department, with no system of records to show who ordered the supplies or whether they were as ordered or what disposition was made of the supplies received.

HAS ASSOCIATION LAID DOWN ON JOB?

President Reed Quoted in Public as Saying Citizens Have Quit Him.

The astounding part of it, said Senator Folkes, is that the figures have circulated what he termed the "biggest knock" this city has ever had.
