

GETTING FRIGHTENED.—A New York butter speculator a few days ago sent orders to his agent in Potsdam, New York, to sell a thousand tubs of butter which he had been holding for higher prices for the most he could get. The splendid condition of the fall feed, taken in connexion with the reduced consumption of butter, will disappoint many farmers and speculators who are holding their butter for higher prices. It was selling in New Hampshire last week for from thirty-five to forty cents a pound.—*Boston Journal.*

The latest "mode" in regard to dessert at fashionable tables of Paris is to serve the fruit still growing, in pots. Pears, cherries, peaches, grapes, plums, figs, lectarines, &c., are placed on the table growing on dwarfed espaliers, the pots standing on silver sockets, or on trays.
