

The rich and elegant collection of French, India and English China and glassware formerly belonging to Charles Carroll of Carrollton, one of the signers of the Declaration of Independence, and at the time of sale the property of Charles Carroll McTavish, Esq., a descendant of the fourth generation, was sold at auction, in Baltimore, yesterday.

Three Federal soldiers, on their way up the River in a transport, last night, when near the Bluff, attempted to make their escape by jumping overboard. Two of them were drowned, and one picked up by a small boat, and delivered to the guard at the fort on the Bluff.
