The Washington Chronicle, in an article on the Evil of the Day, says: "One of the most melancholy signs of the times is the rapacity which is developed in men whose training and antecedents ought, one would think, to have raised them above the temptation to dishonor themselves for gain. The number of provost marshals, draft surgeons, enrolment clerks, and recruiting officers who have been removed and arrested for fraudulent practices is a fearful comment on the low tone of public morals. One of the saddest cases recently is that of Major Jameson, of the 5th Rhode Island, who was formerly pastor of the Third Baptist Church in Providence, and entered the service of his country as chaplain of the 2d, in which capacity he served for some time, when he was made a major. He was appointed to the colored recruiting service in North Carolina, where he engaged in frauds that have led to his trial and dismissal."

Military Committee of the U. S. Senate having under consideration the bill passed by the House authorizing the construction of a ship canal around Niagara Falls, a deputation of leading Boston and New York capitalists appeared before the committee and submitted a proposition to build, with the assistance of western capitalists, at their own expense, a marine railway around Niagara; the Government to have the free use forever of the railway for the transportation of vessels in Government service, on the condition that the Government pay to the company, upon the completion of the work, the sum of one million dollars, and three hundred thousand dollars annually thereafter for the period of ten years.

The suggestion of Dr. Lieber to amend the U. S. Constitution so as to apportion the representation in Congress according to the number of votes in the several States, has been presented for the consideration of the Senate by Mr. Sumner. The author of the proposition urges that the political power of the South should not be augmented to the extent of two-fifths of its black population, while the whole African race is excluded from the ballot-box. He, therefore, proposes to make the number of male citizens of full age, who enjoy the elective franchise, the basis of Congressional representation.

On Saturday, Mr. Pomeroy in the U. S. Senate, offered a joint resolution directing the settlement of a claim of George J. Stubblefield, not exceeding the sum of \$14,746.50, for chewing tobacco furnished to the army under Gen. Sherman at Atlanta Ga., to be made by the Commissary General of Subsistence upon the same principles and evidence as govern the adjustment of claims for authorized supplies.
