

**LOCAL NEWS.**

**GOLD FISH**—The Washington Star mentions that numbers of fish similar in all respects to the gold fish in the reservoir at the Capitol in Washington are now caught by the seine haulers, near Analoatan island. The same thing has occurred all this month in Hunting Creek, and the shores near this place. It is thought the young fish came through the pipes of the reservoir at the Capitol, into the Washington Canal, and thence into the river.

**RELEASED.**—The schooners Campeno and Owens, seized about a week ago in St. Inigoes Creek, Md., by the Potomac flotilla, and brought up to Washington, for having on board goods not in their clearance papers, have been released by the authorities, and allowed to return to St. Mary's Creek, where they belong.

The Congressional party which left Washington some days since for the purpose of visiting Savannah and Charleston, returned to that city on Saturday, on the steamer City of Hudson.

A man named Connors, accidentally shot and killed a man named Ryan, in Washington yesterday. Connors was pointing the gun at R. when it went off. Another case of the folly of playing with fire arms.

**COLD WEATHER**—The weather was so cold on Saturday night last, that thin ice was formed on water in exposed situations. Last night, and early this morning, also, the temperature was sufficiently wintry.

**FISH.**—Some fine shad were in market this morning, selling at from \$1 a \$1.25 per pair. White perch were selling at from 60 to 75 cts. per bunch.

The military authorities in Washington, have notified the civil authorities that the vedettes will hereafter only attend to their military duties; and that the regulation of carriages, private or public, about hotels and elsewhere, will be left to the police.

There has been great activity on the river for the last few days, numbers of steamers, transports, &c., daily arriving and departing.
