

**SOUTHERN NEWS.**

The Washington Chronicle furnishes extracts from the Richmond papers to the 31st ultimo.

The Sentinel gives a report of General Lee, stating that the Union forces were repulsed by General Lewis, of General Gordon's line, the night before, and refers to skirmishing near Dinwiddie Court House, the same day, which, he says, had no definite result. The Richmond Examiner says that, during the assault upon their lines on Wednesday night, five separate charges of the troops, though made with great gallantry, were repulsed with terrible slaughter, and that the Confederate loss was small. The Sentinel gives a description of a fight of Moseby with the 8th Illinois cavalry, near Hamilton, in Loudoun county, in which "the Yankees suffered severely until they were reinforced with infantry, when Moseby withdrew." It also says that Waller, of Moseby's cavalry, was killed, a day or two before, by a scouting party. The Sentinel also speaks of the steadiness and impetuosity of the Confederate troops under General Johnston, during the battle with Sherman on the 19th, and says: "General Johnston is in a position where he can deal blow after blow on the enemy." Also it reports the killing of John T. Waller, grandson of ex President Taylor, with Moseby, the death of John M. Daniel of the Examiner, and the departure from Richmond of Thomas S. Bocock, Speaker of the Confederate House of Representatives of Virginia, and of Wigfall, of Texas, Senator of the Confederate Congress. The Whig asserts that the morale of the Army of the Tennessee is excellent, and "the situation in North Carolina is most encouraging to the Confederates." The Whig adds "when finally the Federal armies are concentrated in front of Richmond, they will not equal in numbers the force with which Grant crossed the Rapidan last year, to say nothing of Butler's Army of the James, while General Lee's with the addition of Johnston's, will be fifty per cent. stronger than it was at the Wilderness. If Lee could then whip Grant in the open field, he will be much better able to do it with all the advantages of the defensive works of Richmond and Petersburg." "The Whig and Examiner, of the 30th, both state that a quorum of the Confederate Legislature could not be obtained the day before.
