

**MR. STANTON'S DESPATCH**

WASHINGTON D. C.,

April 4—11 P. M.

Major General John A. Dix, New York:

The following particulars dated at City Point, April 4, 8. a. m., give the latest information received from Richmond.

General Wentzel telegraphs from Richmond that of the railroad stock he found there twenty-eight locomotives, forty four passenger and baggage cars, and one hundred and six freight cars.

At 3.30 this morning, General Grant, from Sutherland Station, ten miles from Petersburg, towards Burksville, telegraphs as follows: "General Sheridan picked up twelve hundred prisoners to-day, and from three to five hundred more have been gathered by other troops.

The majority of the arms that were left in the hands of the remnant of Lee's army now scattered between Richmond and where his troops are. The country is also full of stragglers; the line of retreat marked with artillery, ammunition, burned or charred wagons, caissons, ambulances, &c."
