SECRETARY SEWARD.

At three o'clock yesterday we called at the residence of Secretary Seward, and learned from Doctor Notson that the Secretary rested much easier, and was improving. He now eats as much as he did before his attempted assassination.

Mr. Frederick W. Seward still lies in an insensible state, but Dr. Notson thinks he shows signs of improvement.

Major Seward is now moving about the house, and is out of danger, his wounds being only flesh wounds, though quite painful.

Major Rathburn, stepson of Senator Harris, we are pleased to learn through the doctor, is sitting up and doing very well.

LATER.—At eleven o'clock last evening Mr. Seward was regarded as much improved, and there is no longer reason to apprehend a serious result from the wounds inflicted on him. During yesterday he was able to sit up awhile and converse.—*Wash. Chronicle.*

J. WILKES BOOTH, the assassin of President Lincoln, is the son of the late J. B. Booth, the celebrated actor, and is about 27 or 28 years of age. He is described as in height, 5 feet 8 inches; weight, 160 pounds; compact build; hair, jet black, inclined to curl, medium length, parted behind; eyes, black, and heavy dark eyebrows; wears a large seal ring on little finger; when talking, inclines his head forward; looks down. The attempted murderer of Mr. Seward, is in height 6 feet 1 inch; hair black, thick, full and straight; no beard; cheeks red on the jaws; face moderately full; 22 or 23 years of age. Mr. Ferguson testifies that when Booth leaped on the stage, and just before he disappeared, he looked up, and he heard him say, "I have done it," and then lost sight of him.

The National Intelligencer states "on the highest authority, that it has been ascertained that there was a regular conspiracy to assassinate every member of the Cabinet together with the Vice President. Booth, it is said, sent his card up to the Vice President at the hotel, but Mr. Johnson could not conveniently see him. The names of the severally appointed assassins are, we understand, known; and after the present investigation is concluded and published, the public will be astounded at the developments."
