One Hundred Thousand Dollars Reward.

The murderer of our late beloved President, Abraham Lincoln, is still at large!!!

FIFTY THOUSAND DOLLARS REWARD will be paid by this Department for his apprehension, in addition to any reward offered by Municipal authorities or State Executives.

TWENTY-FIVE THOUSAND DOLLARS REWARD will be paid for the apprehension of G. A. ATZEROT, sometimes called "Port Tobacco," one of Booth's accomplices!

TWENTY-FIVE THOUSAND DOLLARS REWARD will be paid for the apprehension of DAVID C. HEROLD, another of Booth's accomplices!

LIBERAL REWARDS will be paid for any information that shall conduce to the arrest of either of the above named criminals or their accomplices!

All persons harboring or secreting the said persons, or either of them, or aiding or assisting their concealment or escape, will be treated as ACCOMPLICES in the murder of the President and the attempted assassination of the Secretary of State, and shall be subject to trial before a Military Commission and the punishment of DEATH!

Let the stain of innocent blood be removed from the land by the arrest and punishment of the murderers!

All good citizens are exhorted to aid public justice on this occasion. Every man should consider his own conscience charged with this solemn duty, and rest neither night nor day until it be accomplished.

FOREIGN NEWS.

By the arrival at New York of the steamship Persia, we have advices from Europe to the 9th inst. Some further particulars are given concerning the firing upon the Niagara and Sacramento, in the harbor of Lisbon.—The difficulty has been settled amicably, however, by the dismissal of the Governor of Belem Fort, and by saluting the U. S. flag.

The question of providing for the defence of Canada has given rise to a protracted debate in the British House of Commons. Strong doubts appear to have been expressed by military officers as to the ability to put Canada in a defensible condition; but the general tenor of the debate indicated that the appropriation asked for would be conceded.

The adjustment of the Schleswig Holstein dispute seems to be as remote as ever. The Federal Diet have adopted a resolution requesting Austria and Prussia to cede Holstein to the Duke of Austenburg. Austria has agreed to the proposition, provided that Prussia would also give her consent, but the latter refused to do so, and expressed her determination to retain possession of the Duchies until a solution should be reached that was more in accordance with her own convictions and satisfactory to other parties interested in the matter.
