

A telegraphic dispatch in the Northern papers, from Washington, says:—"Captain Lytle, of General Patrick's Staff, has been ordered to Alexandria to superintend the establishment of an immense depot or prison for citizen prisoners arrested within the lines of the Army of the Potomac."

A dispatch from Fortress Monroe reports that General Graham's expedition, the object of which was "the clearing out of a body of Confederates in Matthews and Gloucester counties, Va., as well as to capture and destroy several large granaries and release several hundred slaves, besides impressing all the cattle in the neighborhood which could possibly give any aid or comfort to the enemy," has been heard from by Gen. Butler, and "is all safe, having met with great success."

On Saturday last bids for furnishing the U. S. Government with flour were opened in Washington. There were a large number of bidders present, and bids were made for \$96,000 barrels. The bids ranged from \$7.60 to \$8.30, and 37,000 barrels were taken at prices ranging from \$7.60 to \$7.73—all of it being No. 2 flour.

It is stated that General Burnside's command will not journey to the Department of the South, but will bear an intimate relation to the operations of the Army of the Potomac.

The recruiting of negro soldiers is actively progressing throughout Maryland and large numbers of recruits are daily arriving in Baltimore.

The Confederates, are repairing the railroad communications in Central Mississippi, which were interrupted by the recent raid of Sherman from Vicksburg to Meridian.

Gen. Grant arrived in Washington, yesterday.
